WIN-THE-WAR RECIPES.

These recipes are issued by the
Fredericton Food Control Committee.

Buckwheat Pudding.

5 cups scalded milk.
One-third cup buckwheat.
½ cup molasses or honey.
1 teaspoon lemon.
1 egg.
1 teaspoon salt.

Mix and sift dry ingredients; beat
the egg, add the molasses and milk
and stir slowly into dry ingredients.
Bake in a greased pudding dish in a
moderate oven until firm—about 1½
hours. Serves 15 helpings.

Baked Haddock or Cod.

Split and bone fish, place in baking
pan, put pieces of butterine or drip-
ping over it, salt, pepper and dredge
with flour. Bake in hot oven 25 to 35
minutes, basting well.

Chocolate Pudding.

Serves 8 or 10 persons.

3 tablespoons butter,
Two-thirds cup sugar,
1 egg,
1 cup milk,
¼ cups graham flour,
1 cup white flour,
4½ teaspoons baking powder,
2½ squares Baker's chocolate,
Salt.

Cream the butter, add sugar gradu-
ally and egg well beaten; mix and sift
flour with baking powder and salt, and
add alternately with milk to first mix-
ture; then add chocolate melted, turn
into buttered mould, cover and steam
two hours. Serve with hard sauce or—

Chocolate Sauce.

2 tablespoons butter,
1 tablespoon flour,
A pinch of salt,
1 cup boiling water,
1 square chocolate,
4 tablespoons sugar,
Vanilla.

Melt butter in saucepan, add flour
and salt, mix smooth, add hot water,
stirring well, add chocolate and sugar,
stir until melted, add vanilla just be-
fore serving.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

Notice is hereby given, that appli-
cation will be made at the next session
of the Legislature of the Province of
New Brunswick for the passage of an
Act to incorporate the New Brunswick
Western Railway Company, with a
capital stock of \$400,000.00, with power
to build and operate a line of railway
from a point on the River Saint John
in the County of York between Med-
detic and Pokiook and a point in the
Parish of North Lake in the said
County at or near the head of North
Lake, being on the international bound-
ary between the United States of Amer-
ica and the Dominion of Canada, and
there to connect with the Eastern
Maine Railroad chartered by the Leg-
islature of the State of Maine, with all
the usual powers incidental thereto,
and with authority to acquire by pur-
chase or otherwise, and own, operate
and sell hydro-electric power and en-
ergy for all purposes.
