Trade With United States In the year ending 31st March, 1917, we bought goods to the value of 865 millions abroad, and of these 678 millions came from the United States. As we sold that country only 290 millions we had to find 388 millions in money or securities. We can now sell securities nowhere but at home, and our export and import business is done almost entirely with Great Britain and the United States. We export to Great Britain enough more than we import to cover our shortage

Since the United States has entered the war, however, States has entered the war, however, large orders for war supplies for their use have been placed in Canada, and it is too early to tell how these will affect our trade balance with that country. It should not be hard to un-derstand from these figures how vitally important it is that we should not buy outside Canada a dollar's worth of merchandise that is not abso-lutely required for our most pressing


