Ald. Reid's Statement.

Ald. Reid, chairman of the finance committee, after the statement was placed before the Council, made a brief explanation showing that the apparent overdraft of \$33,844.48 was not really as great. The overdraft of the previous year had been \$30,309.29, which was less by \$3,535.19. But it should be remembered that during the year \$8,500 had been expended for fire apparatus for which bonds afterward had been issued and \$6,747.63 had been paid for Halifax relief. Both items, totalling \$15,247.63, should be deducted from the apparent overdraft, leaving \$18,596.85, which was \$11,712.44 less than the overdraft of 1916.
