Lieut. Ely, of Lafayette Escadrille, in Posthumous Letter, Describes Escape in Long Plunge.

Hurtling earthward in an aeroplane apside down from a height of 5,000 feet is an experience few aviators survive to describe. Just what a flyer's sensations are throughout such a desperate fight for control were vividly pictured in a letter written to a classmate by Lieut, Dinsmore Ely of the Lafayette Escadrille, who died a few days ago in France from in juries suffered in a subsequent air plane accident.
