Its Value Appreciated Much More

are valuable additions. In making a stock from fresh or cooked bones and meat, they should be covered with cold water, allowed to soak thirty minutes, then brought to a slow boil. Simmer three or four hours. During the last hour of cooking, add seasonings of vegetables, salt and pepper.

The water in which vegetables have been cooked may be used instead of plain water and less seasonings added Any left-over vegetables may be added toward the end of cooking.

Nourishment Can Be Increased.

To increase the nourishment of a soup, cereals are excellent. Left-over rice, barley or even cooked breakfast food may be stirred in at the end (allowing time enough to heat the cereal), or a small amount of rice or bar ley may be put in the last hour of cooking. Allow about one-half cup of raw cereal to one quart of soup.

If you have just vegetable water and vegetables left and want the meat flavor, a small amount of beef extract or one or two bouillon cubes may be used instead.

Vegetable soup: 3 buillon cubes, cups cold water, half cup uncooked BIG DEMAND rice, 1 cup mixed cooked vegetables (chopped), or 2 cups meat stock, two cups vegetable water, salt and pepper Cook gently all except vegetables, salt and pepper for 20 to 30 minutes. Then add vegetables and season to taste.
