WIN-THE-WAR RECIPES.

These recipes are issued by the
Fredericton Food Control Committee.

Bran Biscuits. (Small portion.)

1 cup bran (educator)
Half cup white flour,
Quarter cup molasses,
Half level teaspoon soda,
Half cup milk (if sour milk, add a
little more).

Drop in very small teaspoonfuls far
apart. Cook in moderate oven.

Rice With Cheese and Tomatoes.

1 cup uncooked rice,
3 oz. American cheese,
1 pt. canned tomatoes.

Cook rice. In a baking dish arrange
layers of rice and tomatoes, having
rice at top and bottom. Sprinkle the
grated cheese on top. Bake.

Meatless Loaf.

1 cup chopped peanuts,
Three-quarter cup chopped car-
rots,
Half cup peas,
1 cup bread crumbs,
1½ cups tomato stock,
1 onion chopped fine,
1 cup boiled rice,
1 egg,
Salt and pepper.

Mix all ingredients together, put in
buttered mold and steam one hour
and bake half an hour.

position of the Minister had not been
taken up. However, in his own par-
ish, the Department had helped. One
car of seed oats, sixty tons of fertil-
izer and considerable quantities of
seed wheat had been distributed, and
he could inform the House that it
was all to be paid for by the middle
of May. If the department had not
come to the assistance of the farmers
there, they would have gone without,
and all due credit should be given the
Minister. Uncomplimentary refer-
ence had been made from the opposi-
tion side to the Minister of Public
Works, and he would be remiss in his
duty if he did not touch upon the mat-
ter. The senior member for York had
severely criticised expenditures in his
own county. It was the first occasion
which he knew of in which an hon.
member had taken the ground that too
much was spent. The gist of his re-
marks was that too much work had
been done and too much money spent.
He had referred to the methods of
handling crews. The hon. member
should know something about crews,
for at Bear Island he had had two
crews operating—one dredging out by
day and the other putting back by
night.

In Sunbury county, work done by
the Public Works Department and
classed as permanent work, would
last longer than the majority of the
members of the House, unless they
lived to be very old men. And in the
same county there was wharfing done
