





Any person holding, or having in his possession, or under his control cane sugar in quantities greater than is prescribed in this order, shall forth with return such sugar to the dealer from whom it was purchased, and such dealer shall accept same if it be in good condition, and pay for same at the purchase price, or at the current market price, whichever be the lower; and if the same be not purchased, the facts and circumstances shall forthwith 'e reported to the Canada Food Board by the sald dealer. 4. In addition to the penalties for violation of this Order, is provided, any cane sugar hereafter held of pur chased in excess of the amounts here in prescribed may be seized after the fifteenth of May, 1918, by the Canada Food Board, and such sugar so seized shall thereby be forfeited to His Ma-
