RULE OF ROAD NOT TO BE CHANGED THIS YEAR

Otherwise New Highway Act is in Force---
A. George Blair Appointed K. C.--Price of School Books Likely to be Advanced.

(St. John Telegraph.)

The old rule of the road, turning to the left, throughout New Brunswick, which it had been suggested to change, was adhered to by the government in session here yesterday. It had been claimed that it would be well if traffic were directed to the right, but the government decided not to put the change into effect at this time at any rate. The new Road Act was, however, proclaimed without any other change than Section 15, which provided for the proposed change.

On the advice and recommendation of Messrs. Price, Waterhouse & Company, it was decided to reorganize the auditing and accounting departments. The details of these changes could not be learned from the members of the government.

King's Counsel.

The council, acting upon the recommendation of Chief Justice Hazen and Chief Justice McKeown, decided to approve of the appointment of A. George Blair, a king's counsel. Mr. Blair is a son of the late Hon. A. G. Blair, a former premier of the province. Blair, a former premier of the province, was a member of the provincial railway commission at Ottawa.

Five new agricultural associations received incorporation at the hands of the council. It was decided that the new theatre tax come into effect on June 1, the regulations being passed upon as provided in the act and al-

ready given out. The appointment of all the revisors for the different counties was made.

School Books.

If there is no increase in the retail price of school books this year it will mean a loss to the province of upwards of \$4,000. School book estimates were gone into carefully yesterday, and it was found that a general increase had been made in quotations of from ten to fifteen per cent. In view of this fact in all probability the price of school books will have to be advanced. During yesterday's session the council met as the provincial board of health and the commissioners of the provincial hospital.

Normal School Entrance.

Acting upon the recommendation of the superintendent of education it was decided to reduce the entrance age limit to the provincial normal school from seventeen to sixteen years. This action was taken in view of the scarcity of teachers due to the effects of the war.

School Board Chairman.

John T. Hawke of Moncton, was prevailed upon to accept the chairmanship of the board of school trustees for the city of Moncton. To date the council in its sessions has dealt with no less than 167 different matters. The sessions will be continued this morning and this afternoon when it is likely that all the matters to come before the council will be completed.

OFFICIAL ORDER CONCERNING BUYING SUGAR AND FLOUR

The following are the official orders with regard to sugar and flour:

Sugar.

1. No person shall hold or have in his possession, or under his control at any one time, cane sugar more than is sufficient for his ordinary requirements for a period not exceeding fifteen days, except as hereinafter provided:

(a) A person living at a greater distance than two miles, and less than five miles from a dealer licensed by

the Canada Food Board, may have in his possession, or under his control, cane sugar not more than is sufficient for his ordinary requirements for a period not exceeding thirty days; a person living at a greater distance than five miles, and less than ten miles from a dealer licensed by the Canada Food Board, may have in his possession, or under his control, cane sugar not more than is sufficient for his ordinary requirements for a period not exceeding sixty days; and a person living at a distance of ten miles or more from such dealer, may have in his possession, or under his control, cane sugar not more than is sufficient for his ordinary requirements for a period not exceeding one hundred and twenty days.

(b) A manufacturer licensed by the Canada Food Board using cane sugar in the manufacture of his products, and a wholesale dealer and a retail dealer licensed by the Canada Food Board, may have in his possession, or under his control, cane sugar not more than is sufficient for his ordinary trade requirements for a period not exceeding forty-five days.

2. This order shall not apply to manufacturers of cane sugar.

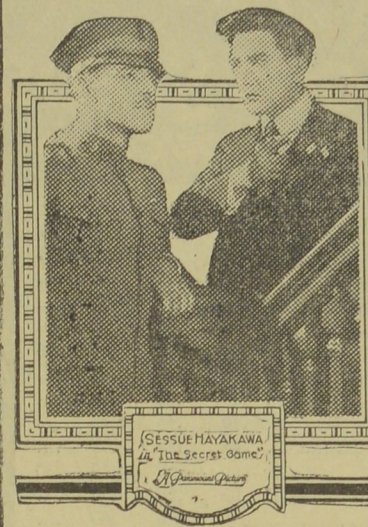
3. Any person holding, or having in his possession, or under his control, cane sugar in quantities greater than is prescribed in this order, shall forthwith return such sugar to the dealer from whom it was purchased, and such dealer shall accept same if it be in good condition, and pay for same at the purchase price, or at the current market price, whichever be the lower; and if the same be not purchased, the facts and circumstances shall forthwith be reported to the Canada Food Board by the said dealer.

4. In addition to the penalties for violation of this Order, is provided, any cane sugar hereafter held or purchased in excess of the amounts here prescribed may be seized after the fifteenth of May, 1918, by the Canada Food Board, and such sugar so seized shall thereby be forfeited to His Majesty, and shall be disposed of as this Board may direct from time to time.

Flour.

1. No person shall hold, or have in his possession, or under his control at any one time, flour made wholly or in part from wheat more than is sufficient for his ordinary requirements for a period not exceeding fifteen days, except as hereinafter provided:

(a) A person living at a greater distance than two miles, and less than five miles from a dealer licensed by the Canada Food Board, may have in his possession, or under his control,

LICENSING OF CHAUFFEURS

ANY person operating a motor vehicle as a chauffeur is required under an amendment passed at the last session of the Legislature to the Motor Vehicle Act, to undergo an examination in order to obtain a certificate of competency.

The undersigned has been authorized by the Hon. P. J. Veniot, Minister of Public Works, to examine all applicants for a chauffeur's license, and to issue certificates of competency which must be forwarded to the Department of Public Works. All parties desiring such examination must send in their applications to the undersigned immediately, addressed to Provincial Garage, Chipman Hill, St. John, N. B., so that they may be notified of the date and place of examination.

All chauffeurs now holding licenses obtained since January 1st, 1918, as well as all new applicants, are required to undergo an examination.
