WASHING SCRIM, CURTAINS.

Unless Badly Streaked, They Should
be Cleansed Only in Cold or Luke-
warm Water.

The washing of scrim or lace curtains is a simple matter, if one bears in mind that the dirt is mostly on the surface, and for that reason they should be washed in cold or lukewarm water. Soiled curtains should never be put directly into hot water. Shave some white soap and dissolve in hot water, and add enough to cold water to make slightly soapy. Allow curtains to soak five or ten minutes. With the hands press up and down a minute or two, but do not rub. Drain and place in fresh supply of soapy water, and repeat process till dirt is removed. If not badly soiled, two or three changes are sufficient. Rinse till clear and if curtains are white, scald if it seems necessary.

When curtains have been used at windows which are frequently open, they are apt to have streaks, which can be removed only by the use of soap and hot water—scalding or boiling hot—but this should not be done until all surface dirt is removed by the cold water process. Ecu curtains may be improved by lying some time in hot water to which has been added some clear strong coffee.

DO'S AND DON'T'S.

In these days when we are continually urged to save, don't forget to save yourself. Many extra duties are laid on woman, and much is expected of her—perhaps too much.

Don't lift a gallon of molasses, but keep the syrup pitcher filled and use from that.

Don't cross the floor unnecessarily, but keep spoons in everything—salt, soda, washing powder.

Keep a measuring cup in different kinds of flour, meal and cereals. Keep utensils for working near your place for cooking, also some near the sink or on the stove. Try to plan your work so as to save strength, time and steps.

Don't roll out cookies. Make them so they will drop from the spoon.

Keep a little kerosene in a bottle that has held toilet water and has a stopper that will allow a little to be shaken out on the bottom of smutty pans. If the woodwork around the sink is covered with zinc, keep it clean and bright with the oil.

When you use the egg beater, instead of laying it down for the egg to dry on, put it at once under the cold water tap and rinse off; then lay in a warm place to dry. No more washing is needed.
