### PREACHER SPEEDS SHIPS FOR WAR

Rev. Dr. Eaton to Tour Country  
—Give Spy "Own Damned Bomb"—Workmen Control.

(New York Sun.)

Rev. Dr. Charles A. Eaton, on leave from the Madison Avenue Presbyterian church, is touring the country as chief of National Service Section to the United States Shipping Board and the Emergency Fleet Corporation. The section is making efforts to accelerate the work on steamships for the government in various shipyards of the United States.

The campaign was carried to the yards of the Submarine Boat Company at Port Newark Terminal last night when Dr. Eaton, addressing 500 superintendents and foremen, told them of the importance of the work they are doing.

"I was born in a shipyard," he said. "One of the first smells I got in this world that I can remember was hot tar and oakum. You can't tell me anything about shipbuilding that I don't know — and you can't tell me anything about shipbuilders.

Nation in Their Hands.

"Do you men know that you hold in your hands the destiny of this country? Well, you do, and don't let anyone tell you any different. In these plants here in Port Newark you're handling 800,000 tons of shipping, enough to win this war with.

"What have we got to worry about the Germans for if you men stick to your job six days a week the way the men do over in the trenches? Germans? I say to hell with the Germans!

"You fellows are doing a work here as important as the work of the men in the trenches, and you've got to realize it. You are going to get a lot of spies here. They'll creep in. If you ever come across a man with a bomb don't say: 'Come outside, brother, and let us pray.' Don't slap him on the wrist. Truss him up, take him out on the meadows, place his damned bomb on his chest and then stand off a few feet and watch him get blown to hell, where he belongs, with the kaiser.

Ottawa, Feb. 25. — Hon. C. A. Magrath, Dominion fuel controller, has returned from the Maritime Provinces where, in company with Mr. J. G. Walters, president of the trades and labor congress, he has been in conference with mine owners and mineworkers. The result is a promise from the miners to increase the production of coal in Nova Scotia by at least twelve thousand tons per week. An effort will be made to secure one thousand men from Newfoundland to work in the coal mines of Nova Scotia.
