THE ALLIES GIVE NO HEED TO PROSPECTS OF PEACE

The Offensive on All Fronts is Being Kept Up
with Great Violence—Italians are Driving the
Austrians Towards the Montenegro Frontier
—Huns in France and Flanders Offering a
Strenuous Resistance to the British, French
and American Forces.

New York, Oct. 28.—The Associated Press has issued the following:

While both Germany and Austria are seeking to secure a cessation of hostilities and Turkey also is reported to be favorably disposed toward peace the Entente Allied troops on all the battlefronts are giving no heed to peace proposals, but are continuing without mercy to drive their foes before them.

And in all the battle zones the Allies are meeting with marked success. In France the German battle line is slowly disintegrating under the violence of the Allied offensive; in Northern Italy the Austro-Hungarians are being forced back by the British, French and Italians with heavy losses in men killed, wounded or made prisoner; near the shores of the Mediterranean in Albania the Italians are driving the Austrians toward the Montenegro frontier, while in Asiatic Turkey, both in Syria and Mesopotamia the British are fast clearing the Turks from their former strongholds.

Teutons Giving Way

Although the Germans in France and Flanders are still strenuously resisting the Allied attempts to break their line, they are steadily giving way under the force of the attacks. In the other theatres there apparently is not the same disposition to offer stubborn denial of the right of way except possibly in the mountain region of Italy where an attempt is being made by the Allied forces to open the back door into Austria.

South of Valenciennes, in France, Field Marshal Haig's forces, notwithstanding stiff opposition, have advanced their line in the general operation which has in view the capture of Valenciennes and pressing on toward Mons and Maubeuge in the general converging movement that is going on between Belgium and the region north of Verdun.

French Win Victory

Further south, from the Oise River to the region of Reims, the French have gained a signal victory by forcing a retreat of the enemy in the big salient north of Laon, and are threatening to cause the collapse of the entire German line eastward through a fast turning movement. American troops have been thrown into the line near Reims and have advanced nearly a mile, and have taken numerous prisoners. The German war office admits the success of the thrust of the French between the Oise and Serre Rivers, and says that the German lines were withdrawn Sunday night to a front west of Guise and east of Crecy.

The Americans

In connection with this general movement the Americans northwest of Verdun have begun an operation which possibly may have important results. For the first time since the Americans entered the war they have opened fire against the back lines of the enemy with their new long range guns, and are heavily bombarding Longuyon, some fifteen miles distant from the American first line positions. It is over the territory through which the Americans' guns are throwing their shells that the Germans have been reinforcing their lines eastward.

and should the blasting process prove effective in blazing a trail along the Meuse for a quick advance by the Americans. It is not improbable that a German retreat from the region east of St. Quentin northeastward toward Luxembourg would be necessitated.

Italian Front

On the northern Italian front hard fighting is in progress between the Brenta and Piave Rivers, along the Piave the Allied troops have been successful in crossing the river, inflicting heavy casualties on the enemy, and taking more than 9,000 prisoners.

In Albania the Austrians have been driven by the Italians in the region of Alessio, which lies 20 miles south-east of Scutari, just south of the Montenegro border. In Serbia the Austrians have evacuated Kragujevatz, 55 miles southeast of Belgrade, and are still in retirement toward the Danube.

The Turks are fast being driven out of Mesopotamia, having reached a position more than 155 miles north of Bagdad, while in Syria General Allenby's troops are keeping in close contact with the Ottoman forces north of Aleppo.

Dr. McNally reported that the number of cases was decreasing and that a temporary hospital was not necessary.

Dr. Holden stated that influenza was positively at a standstill in Fredericton. A temporary hospital could not be established and made ready in time to be of any use. No person in Fredericton had suffered from lack of medical attendance. The district nurse had done a noble work.

Miss Stewart, district visiting nurse reported that she had experienced no trouble except in the cases of people who would not help themselves.

Assistant Visiting Nurse

Miss Gordon formerly of Blackville who recently returned from the United States, has been appointed assistant to Miss Kate Stewart, visiting nurse. She has taken up her duties.

Seventeenth Death

The seventeenth death from pneumonia in Fredericton occurred this morning in the case of Mrs. Annie Saunders wife of Mr. Sterling Saunders. The total number of influenza cases which have been reported to the Board of Health since the beginning of the outbreak has been 528 of which 87 developed into pneumonia.

Victory Loan Campaign

The Victory Loan Campaign is in full swing today. No statement has been made yet or any estimate given of how the work is succeeding. The salesmen however say that they are all doing well and expect big results from their work. The public is receiving them well and are dipping into their pockets to help out the work.

Late Mrs. Annie Saunders

The deceased was twenty-seven years of age and is survived by seven children and her husband Mr. Sterling Saunders. She was a daughter of Mr. Edward Lawton of Richbucto. The funeral took place from the late home at two o'clock this afternoon. Rev. J. S. Sutherland conducted a short service. Interment was made at the Rural Cemetery.

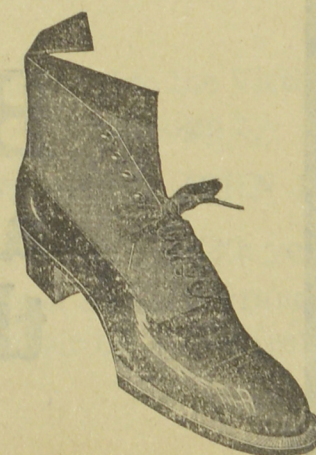
