### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

PRUNES IN WAR TIME.

Prune Charlotte.

Remove the stones from three cupsful of stewed and sweetened prunes. Line a buttered pudding dish with slices of well buttered bread. Turn in the prunes and flavor with a teaspoonful of vanilla extract. Cover with slices of buttered bread and bake.

Serve with powdered sugar and cream or with a thin custard.

Prune Pie.

Line a pie tin with a rich pastry crust. Fill with pitted prunes and bake. Cover with a meringue made with the beaten whites of two eggs and two tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar. Brown the meringue in the oven and serve the pie hot or cold.

Jellied Prunes.

Wash half a pound of prunes, soak them over night in cold water. Simmer in the same water until half done. Slice half a large lemon and break into one inch pieces half a stick of cinnamon; add both to the prunes and finish cooking. Remove from the fire and stir in half a cupful of honey, taking care not to break the fruit. Let stand until cold. Strain off the liquid and add gelatin, following the proportions given for jelly making on the package. Use a portion of the prune juice to soften the gelatin and part of the required amount of boiling water to dissolve it. Fill a ring mold to the depth of half an inch with the gelatin mixture, and stand it in ice water until hard. Pit the prunes, keeping them as whole as possible; place in the mold and fill the latter with the remaining gelatin mixture. When hard unmold and fill the centre with half a pint of cream, whipped, sweetened with honey and flavored with vanilla.

Prune Pudding.

Two cupfuls of cold water, three tablespoonfuls of cocoa, seven table-



spoonfuls of cornstarch. Place the water in a saucepan and add the cocoa and starch. Stir until the starch is dissolved. Bring to the boiling point and then cook for four minutes. Remove from the fire and sweeten to taste. Cool slightly, now whip in the stiffly beaten white of egg left from the Hollandaise sauce. Pour into mould or individual custard cups. When ready to serve lay three cooked prunes on each service. Remove stones from the cooked prunes and roll in finely chopped peanuts.
