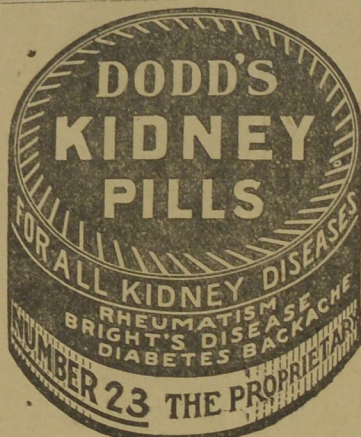


BOOZE STILL IS PLENTIFUL IN QUEBEC

HEAVY PENALTIES FOR THOSE WHO FAIL TO REGISTER

Liabie to a Fine of \$100 and Imprisonment for One Month---Disqualified From Voting at a Federal Election---Not Allowed to Purchase a Railway or Steamboat Ticket or Obtain Lodgings at an Hotel.

The penalties applicable to those who fail to register on or before Saturday, June 22nd are very severe.

Here are a few of them:—

(a) He shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars, and to imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month; and moreover to a further penalty of ten dollars for each day after the day when he should have registered during which he shall continue to be unregistered.

(b) He shall, for so long as he remains unregistered, forfeit his right and be disqualified to vote at any Dominion election; and if he fail to register within thirty days after the time when he should have registered he shall forfeit his right and be disqualified to vote at the next Dominion general election;

(c) He shall, for so long as he remains unregistered, forfeit his right and be disqualified to obtain or continue in any employment, or to receive or earn any salary, emolument or wages;

(d) He shall, for so long as he remains unregistered forfeit his right and be disqualified to the services of any person in his employment, al-

though he shall nevertheless remain liable for any salary emolument or wages earned by such person during that time;

(e) He shall, for so long as he remains unregistered, forfeit his right and be disqualified to purchase, receive or have in his possession any railway steamboat or other public conveyance ticket, other than a tram car or street car ticket, or to travel by any railway steamboat or other public conveyance, except a tram car of street car, unless for the purpose of any prosecution or execution of sentence under these regulations;

(f) He shall, for so long as he remains unregistered, forfeit his right and be disqualified to board or lodging at any hotel, public house, inn, tavern, club, restaurant or boarding house.

(g) Any person who employs or continues him in his employment while unregistered, or pays him any salary emolument or wages in respect of any period while he is unregistered, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty corresponding in character and amount to that which the unregistered employee himself shall by reason of his non-registration at the time, have incurred.

DR. BELAND HAD ROUGH TREATMENT FROM THE HUNS

Canadian M. P. was in Belgium when War Broke out and Remained in Antwerp After Its Occupation by the Germans--- Was Refused Permission to go to the Bedside of His Dying Wife.

London, June 13.—Wallace Elson, recently released from Stadt Vogel prison, where Dr. Beland was imprisoned, tells in the current Blackwood's Magazine a moving story of Beland's captivity.

Shortly before the outbreak of the war, Dr. Beland married a Belgian lady and took up residence in the village of Capellan, north of Antwerp. He was surprised by the news of war while on a holiday in the Pyrenees, and returned to Capellan.

He lived through the siege of Antwerp and witnessed the entry of the armies of Von Emmich. German officers were quartered in his chateau, and relying upon their word that he would not be molested in any way whatsoever, he remained there instead of crossing the Dutch frontier into Holland, only about half a mile distant.

The officers who had given him this assurance left for service elsewhere, and other officers came who chose to disregard the word of their colleagues given to Beland. He was arrested in June, 1915, and taken to Stadt Vogel prison. There, in one of the large corner cells, he was confined.

Heard of Wife's Illness.

Just before Christmas, 1916, Dr. Beland received a telegram from a doc-

tor informing him that his wife was lying seriously ill at Capellan, he being distressed up to the date of the receipt of this news by letters from his family which led him to believe such an eventuality was imminent.

He had repeatedly endeavored to procure from the Berlin military authorities permission to return to Capellan on parole, or to take up residence with his wife at some German Spa. Not one of these efforts was successful.

He appealed to be allowed to go to Capellan on a brief visit, but received no answer. He then received urgent messages from the doctor and his family, imploring him to hasten to his wife's bedside, as she was dying. He said one day to the lieutenant in command of the prison, after he had received no answer to his frantic petitions. "Take me, lieutenant, blindfolded if you wish. I want to see nothing."
