Rhubarb Shortcake

Use two cups of rhubarb, cut small, with cup of sugar in double boiler and cook until rhubarb is tender. Add juice and chopped rind of one lemon. Make a shortcake by any recipe, cut and bake it like biscuit. When done, break open, butter and arrange on a hot dish. Put rhubarb in between, and when serving pour juice over them. when serving pour juice over them.
