WAR TIME RECIPES.

Curried Vegetables.

Clean, scrape or peel and cut into small cubes, a half pound each of carrots, turnips, celery and onions. Par-boil and drain dry on a clean napkin in a colander. Melt a heaping tablespoonful of butter in a saucepan and brown the vegetables but do not burn them. Heat enough brown gravy to cover and stew the vegetables slowly until tender. Add 1 tablespoonful of curry powder, or season with same to taste; simmer 5 minutes, and serve in a border of boiled rice.

Oatmeal Wafers.

The ingredients are 2 cupsful flour, 4 tablespoonfuls sugar, 4 tablespoonfuls cooked oatmeal, half teaspoonful salt, 6 level tablespoonfuls shortening and hot water. Mix the sugar and salt with the flour, work in the shortening with the oatmeal, add just enough hot water to make the dough hold together, roll out as thin as possible and bake in a moderate oven.

Apricots.

Soak dried apricots for a half hour and then wash them thoroughly and soak over night in cold water. Cook until tender, sweeten and serve.

Jellied Apples.

Pare and core the required number of apples and cook with three or four large raisins in the centre of each with one teaspoonful of sugar. Cover and bake. When cool put the apples in cups, fill with liquid orange jelly; when the jelly is set, turn out on plates to serve. Put on each mold one tablespoonful of whipped cream.

KITCHEN KINKS.

To cut fresh bread, dip your knife in boiling water and you will be able to cut the thinnest slice from a fresh loaf.

When making coffee, sprinkle a little salt on the coffee before pouring on boiling water and the flavor will be wonderfully improved. Always warm the pot first.

If too much salt has been put in the soup, slice a raw potato and boil it in the soup for a few minutes. It will absorb much of the salt.

After washing cut glass with soap and water, rinse it in water to which a little blueing has been added. After drying, polish with tissue paper.

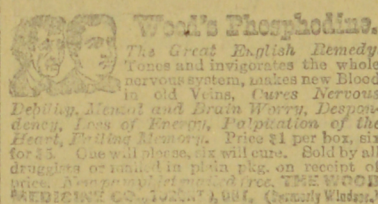
