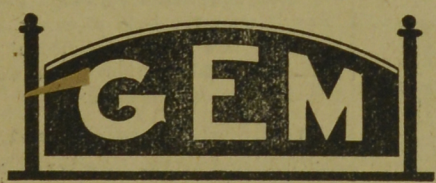

to induce settlement upon the land, to encourage increased agricultural production, and to aid in the development of our agricultural resources.

RETURNED SOLDIERS.

In connection with the demobilization of our forces, my advisers recognize the urgent necessity of provision for the care and vocational training of returned soldiers. Organized effort to provide such legislation to assist them in obtaining it and establishing themselves in civil life is not only important, but essential. A department of the government for this purpose has been constituted and has been vested with necessary powers and duties.

Measures which have been taken by order in council to prevent excessive profits in certain industries and the production of food will be communicated to you, and any change desired will be submitted to you.

A bill for extending the franchise to women, with suitable provisions respecting naturalization, will be submitted and commended to your consideration. Your attention will also be invited to a bill to consolidate and amend the acts relating to railways, a bill relating to daylight saving, bills relating to taxation of war profits and of incomes, and other measures.

CO-OPERATING WITH UNITED STATES.

In order to ensure the fullest co-operation with the government of the United States and to assist in securing the most effective utilization of the resources of both countries for war purposes, a Canadian war mission has been established at Washington and a war trade board constituted at Ottawa.

In view of the need for conserving to the fullest extent all national resources during the war and in furtherance of principal enactments, action has been taken under the War Measures Act, 1914, to prohibit the importation and manufacture of intoxicating beverages and to forbid the transportation thereof into any community where their sale is contrary to law.

My advisers have advised that a complete registration of the manhood and womanhood of Canada over the age of sixteen years is not only important but essential under present conditions. The necessary authority has been provided under the War Measures Act, 1914.

THE HALIFAX DISASTER.

The appalling disaster at Halifax, resulting in the loss of many hundreds of lives and the destruction of a considerable portion of the city and of the adjacent town of Dartmouth, has evoked sympathy for those having suffered. My advisers will submit to you proposals for relieving the distress and loss thus occasioned.

Notwithstanding the critical and trying conditions through which the country has passed during the last three years, the financial stability of Canada has been well maintained. The volume of foreign trade greatly exceeds that attained during any corresponding period in previous years.

The accounts for the last and the estimates for the next fiscal year will be submitted to you without delay, and you will be asked to make the necessary financial provision for the effective conduct of the war.

Notwithstanding disappointments in the eastern theatre of war, there is no reason to doubt the triumph of our cause. The effort of the nations included within the British commonwealth is still unbeaten and will so continue to the end. Unusually earnest and resolute is the spirit of all the Allied nations, and especially of the great neighboring and kindred commonwealth, whose enormous power and vast resources are beginning to make themselves felt.

Mr. Leo Higgins of Oromocto, formerly of Fredericton, met with a painful accident at his home Sunday afternoon. He was cleaning his rifle not knowing that the chamber contained a cartridge. The rifle was discharged and the bullet entered one of his feet. Mr. Higgins was brought to the Victoria Hospital in this city where the bullet was located by X-ray and was extracted. Dr. C. P. Holden attended the case.

Adjourned Until 21st.

The two beer cases in which violation of the Provincial Prohibitory Act by the sale of beer containing a greater alcoholic percentage than two per cent. is charged, were before Police Magistrate Limerick this morning. Several points were argued and evidence was taken. Adjournment was made until the 21st inst.

Proceedings Postponed.

On account of the railways being blocked Saturday by the storm the hearing in the Habeas Corpus proceedings in the case of two men arrested and convicted at Minto for the illegal sale of liquor, did not take place before Judge Crockett. The hearing will be tomorrow.

Marysville, Mar. 18. — Mr. Fraser Saunders has returned from a trip to Chatham, where he has been engaged in work in connection with enforcement of the prohibitory law. Mr. Saunders has succeeded in rounding up several lawbreakers in that vicinity, having had two convictions, including that of a prominent hotel keeper and information having been laid against three other offenders. The hearing of the latter will come up at a later date. Upon his return here a quantity of liquor consigned to a local man was seized upon the complaint of a member of this family. It is unlikely that any action will be taken in this case.

Dr. Harrison preached a very eloquent and touching sermon during the course of which he took occasion to make personal mention of those who had given their lives as a sacrifice to the principles of freedom and justice, and extended sincere sympathy to the relatives.

Invitations have been issued for the celebration of the sixty-first anniversary of the Main Street United Baptist church which will be observed on Thursday, March 28th. A literary and musical program has been prepared for the occasion and a thankoffering will be received.

Mr. Samuel Stafford is acting in the capacity of town marshal temporarily. It is stated that he is likely to accept the position permanently in a short time.
