When the bath was finished—what tints of pink! The whole landscape took on a different hue. There was health in the Saturday night bath, even if there wasn't pleasure.

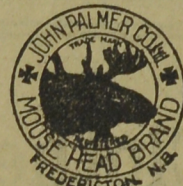
WE RESEMBLE SOME ANIMALS

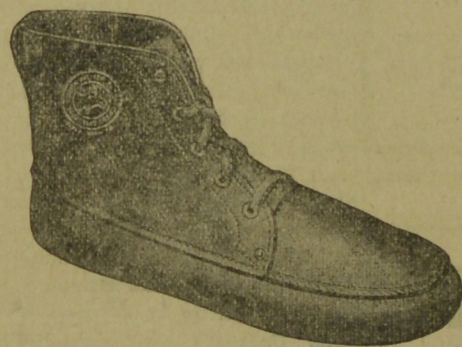

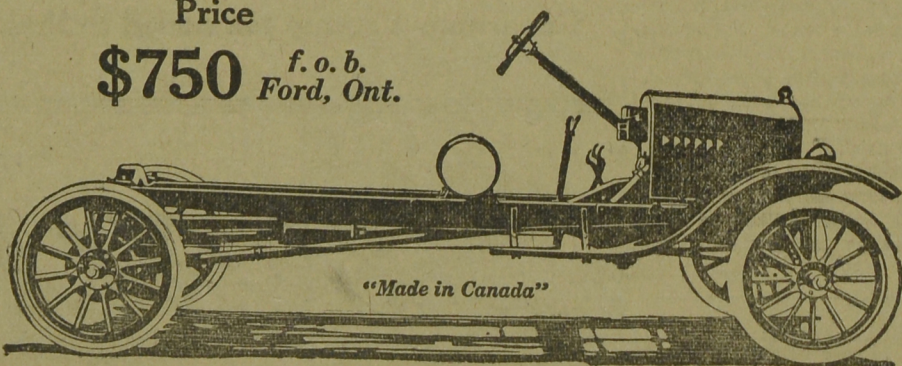

nouncement was received today that the king had conferred the prefix "Royal" upon the body of troops representing this colony because of its bravery on the battlefields of Gallipoli, France and Flanders.

The distinction was suggested by Sir Walter Davidson, former governor of Newfoundland, who visited the regiment on the western front, where he broached the idea to Field Marshal Haig. Later, in England, he took the matter up with Premier Lloyd George and was granted an audience by the king. Field Marshal Haig, in a letter to Colonel Woodruffe, commanding the Newfoundland contingent, wrote:

"I have much pleasure in informing you that His Majesty the King, in view of the magnificent bravery and the resolute determination shown by all ranks, has been graciously pleased to approve the grant of the title 'Royal' to the Newfoundland Regiment. Please accept and convey to all ranks my warmest congratulations that your achievements have met with such well deserved recognition."
