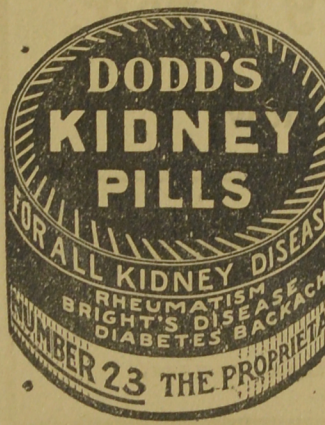

OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

REMOVING STAINS.

Sewing-Machine Oil Stains.

Rub with lard, let stand for several hours, then wash with cold water and soap.

Ink Stains.

Soak in sour milk; if a dark stain remains, rinse in a weak solution of chloride of lime.

Blood Stains.

Soak in cold salt water, then wash in warm water with plenty of soap. Afterward boil.

Machine Oil Stains.

Wet the spot in kerosene oil, then proceed to wash as usual. It will come out almost every time.

Mildew Stains.

Soak the stain thoroughly in lemon-lime for several hours. Rinse in cold water.

Ordinary Grease Stains.

Hot water and soap usually remove these. If fixed by long standing, naphtha, ether or chloroform—all three of which must be kept at a safe distance from either fire or artificial light.

Pitch Stains.

To remove pitch or tar stains soften the stains with lard, then soak in turpentine. With a knife scrape off carefully all the loose surface dirt; sponge clean with turpentine and rub gently till dry.

Fruit Stains.

Stretch fabric with stain over the mouth of a basin and pour boiling water on stain. In cold weather fruit spots can frequently be removed by hanging the stained garment out of doors over night. If stain has been fixed by time, soak article in a weak solution of oxalic acid or hold the spot over fumes of sulphur.

A TRANSPORT SUNK BY HUNS

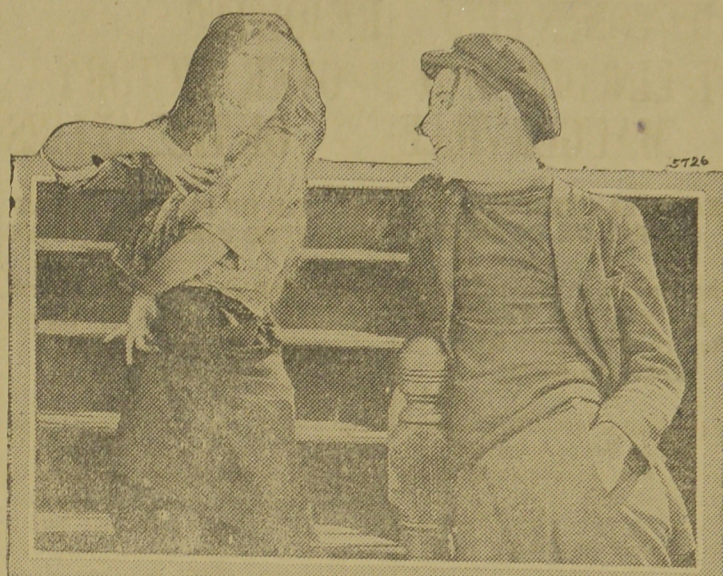
