## WILHELM HELD GUILTY BY EMINENT JURISTS

Lloyd George Dealt With the Matter in a Speech at Newcastle—Formal Abdication by Kaiser and Crown Prince Demanded by Berlin Government—Rumors of a Counter Revolution in Germany Now in the Air.

Newcastle, England, Nov. 29—In a speech delivered here this evening Premier Lloyd George, dealing with the question of the responsibility for the invasion of Belgium, said the British government had consulted some of the greatest jurists of the kingdom and that they unanimously and definitely had arrived at the conclusion that in their judgment the former German emperor was guilty of an indictable offence for which he ought to be held responsible.

### Demands Formal Abdication

London, Nov. 29—The Berlin government according to a news despatch received from Copenhagen by the Exchange Telegraph Company has sent a telegram to the former German Emperor, now in Holland, demanding the formal abdication of himself and the former crown prince.

### Suite Returning

Amsterdam, Nov. 29—The Telegraaf says it understands that the members of the former German emperor's suite who have been staying at Maarn, Holland, will return to Germany today.

### Does Kaiser Plan Return?

London, Nov. 29—The former German emperor contemplates an early return to Germany to reclaim his throne, according to news received in London through a neutral source of high standing, says the Daily Mail.

The newspaper adds that the revolution in Germany is being managed by officers of the German high command with a view to eventually causing its collapse and the triumphant return of the former emperor to Berlin. Some of these officers in civilian clothes have been recognized in the streets of Berlin. Many of them are reported to be dressed as workmen. These officers harangue the crowds as comrades and in every way encourage the revolutionary movement. It is said however that if opportunity offers they will abandon this disguise, contend that the revolution is a failure and begin a counter-revolution.

Agents of these officers, it is declared, are furthering this plot by spreading anti-British propaganda in Holland with the object of embittering the Dutch against the Allies.

### Ex-Empress Arrives

London, Nov. 29—The former Empress of Germany arrived by train Thursday morning at Maarbergen, Holland, and went by automobile to Amerongen, where the former emperor is staying according to a Rotterdam despatch to the Daily Mirror. The former empress seemed in high spirits. She was met at the station by the wife of the German minister at the Hague. The former emperor was not at the station and only a few villagers were about. An automobile load of baggage was taken to the castle, but twenty large trunks were left at the station.

An Amsterdam despatch says Auguste Victoria used a certain amount of ingenuity to escape identification, but the correspondent in a tramp over the muddy roads from Marne, witnessed her departure from the station. Notwithstanding current reports of the serious illness of the ex-empress, the correspondent said she looked quite well. She wore a black hat with veil and a purple costume.

William Hohenzollern, her husband did not go to the station to meet his wife, but Count Von Bentinck was waiting at the station with three motor cars. The former empress left in the first of these, accompanied by another woman, presumably the Countess Kelles.

Then followed Count Von Bentinck with Auguste Victoria's physician, the car flying the flag of Utrecht, while the third car was occupied by two maids and a male servant.

The train in which the former empress travelled was German with three sleeping and two baggage cars, which outwardly were rather dirty, but inside looked quite comfortable.

### Eisner "Dangerous."

Anzeiger in commenting upon the Bavarian premier in breaking off relations with the Berlin foreign office. A similar attitude is taken by the entire Bourgeois press, and even the Socialist Vorwaerts does not believe that Eisner has "taken the right road to assure the unity of the empire and obtain better peace conditions."

The Berlin press in general condemns him as an obstinate, impractical dreamer. It is declared that Eisner was born in Galicia and that there is some doubt about his German citizenship, and this is intensifying the opposition to him in some quarters.

## LEMON EXTRACT NOT CONSIDERED INTOXICATING

Alberta and United States cases to the effect that liquids not manufactured or sold as beverages even if intoxicating if used to excess did not for that reason lose their character. The judgment continues as follows:

### Case in Question

In the case now before me the defendant is charged with selling what is shown to be a bottle of lemon extract which is made up of three different oils with sufficient alcohol to hold the same in solution, it is a preparation which has been prepared and sold by druggists for years. It is prepared by wholesale grocers and sold by retail grocers all over the province. It has never been considered as an intoxicating liquor. The manufacture or sale thereof has never been interfered with in any way under any previous liquor laws. To hold that lemon extract is an intoxicating liquor and that the persons who deal in the same are guilty under the Act, would be to leave every grocer, every druggist and practically every householder in this Province open to prosecution for violation of the Prohibition Act. I cannot bring myself to believe that the Legislature ever intended any such thing. Had the Legislature so intended I think they could have found appropriate words for expressing such an intention. The Legislature not having done so, I do not think that the Court should be asked to place, what in my opinion would be, a very strained construction upon the Act.

### Attention of Legislature

While it may be true that a condition in regard to extracts and tinctures, etc., may have arisen which requires a remedy it is a matter requiring the attention of the Legislature and does not come within the Act so as to enable the Court to deal with it. I, therefore, dismiss the complaint.

## VALLEY R'WAY HEARING AGAIN NEXT SATURDAY

St. John, Nov. 30—Before Chief Justice McKeown in the chancery division of the supreme court yesterday morning, the cases of the King vs. J. K. Flemming and the King vs. W. B. Tennant were resumed. W. P. Jones K. C., of Woodstock, and Peter J. Hughes, of Fredericton, represented the crown and J. B. M. Baxter K. C., was acting for A. B. McConnell, K. C. counsel for Mr. Flemming, while M. G. Teed, K. C., appeared in the interests of Mr. Tennant.

The distinguishing feature of the session was the argument of Messrs. Baxter and Teed that the legislation enacted at the last session of the legislature providing for the return of monies to the crown was not adequate that the act did not allow what it was designed to provide.

At the opening of the morning session counsel for the King moved to add a further claim to that already made against J. K. Flemming, namely a claim of \$9,600, being commissions paid by the Prudential Trust Co. to the defendant. This was allowed by the court.

It was further moved to have certain interrogatories allowed. It was at this juncture that Messrs. Baxter and Teed opposed the interrogatories on the grounds mentioned.
