"It is now only the question of putting down an evil. Persons escaping from Moscow, Petrograd and Vologda and reaching here bring indisput able stories of the executions. The sit uation seems beyond the control of some Bolshevik leaders who themselves are revolting at the bloodshed.

President Tschaikoivsky said he re cently cabled to President Wilson urging the immediate dispatch of more

"Nothing can bring Russia out of this chaos until the Bolshevik terror has been quashed by the force of arm said Tschaikovsky. "The force now here is unable to do this quickly Meanwhile hundreds are dying daily

"The world must understand that Bolshevism, like imperialism ,is a foe to democracy. It is in Russia a mere dictatorship a group of men holding sway by force of arms. They seize every straw, falsifying logic to justify themselves. As an example they now declare that the proposed league of nations is only another scheme to give power to the bourgeoise against the working man."

"Perhaps the world will naturally ask what Russia is doing to help herself," said Tschaikovsky, "and I can only answer that we are doing our best. A recent example is the reorganization of the Government of the North. Now every party and every class is represented. Forgetting politics they are turning their efforts to ward putting down the Bolshevik evil. We are mobilizing our forces, but the Allies must help.'
