AUSTRIA HUNGARY ON THE VERGE OF COLLAPSE

Conditions Virtually Preclude a Continuance of Fighting—Application Has Been Made for an Armistice—Turkish Armies Surrender to the Allies—More Than Fifty Thousand Austrians Have Been Taken Prisoners Within the Past Few Days.

London, Oct. 31—Conditions in the interior of Austria-Hungary virtually preclude a continuance of fighting, according to news received in London this evening. The railways necessary for the maintenance of the military forces of the Dual Monarchy have become utterly disorganized.

All communications between Agram, Fiume, Budapest and Vienna have been interrupted and the railway communications between Berlin and Vienna have been cut.

The monarchy is faced with complete internal anarchy.

Austrian Commander Makes Appeal

London, Oct. 31—The Austrian commander on the Italian front has applied to General Diaz, the Italian commander-in-Chief, for an armistice, the Exchange Telegraph Company states in a despatch to the Standard.

The application, the newspaper adds has been forwarded to the Versailles conference.

Paris Oct. 31—An armistice between the Allies and Turkey was signed today at Mudros, it is officially announced.

Final Military Triumph

London, Oct. 31—Ismail Hakki, commanding the Turkish armies of the group operating in the Tigris region in Mesopotamia, has surrendered with one entire division and the best part of two other divisions, the Evening Standard says.

Through the Dardanelles

London, Oct. 31—Sir George Cave in the House of Commons, confirmed terms of the Turkish armistice, which are now in operation. They include free passage of the fleet through the Dardanelles and the immediate repatriation of British prisoners.

Other terms, it is learned, comprise the occupation of the forts of the Dardanelles.

Summary of the News

New York, Oct. 31—The Associated Press tonight issued the following:

Turkey is out of the war, and Germany's remaining ally, Austria-Hungary, badly defeated on the field of battle her battle line rent in twain and with chaos reigning inside her borders, is pleading for an armistice. Thus far her opportunities have received no better answer than the redoubling of the efforts of the Allies to crush utterly her warriors.

The capitulation of Turkey is believed to have been an unconditional one.

The victories of the Allied forces over the Austro-Hungarians threaten to send what remains of the enemy armies reeling back to their border line shattered and completely vanquished.

More than fifty thousand prisoners have been taken by the Italian, British, French, American and Czecho-Slovak forces, and everywhere, from the mountain region to the plains of Venetia the enemy is being sorely tried. In the mountains where stiff resistance had been offered to keep the foe from entering the back door of Austria, the enemy's front is cracking under the violence of the attacks and important strategic positions are being lost. To the east of the Piave the Allies have driven in a sharp wedge to the northeast of Belluno, some twenty miles from their original point of departure and severed connection between the armies in the north and those on the Venetian plains.

In Full Flight

Over the plains leading toward the Austrian frontier at the Isonzo river the invaders everywhere are in full flight with the Allied troops pressing them hard. Here the debacle seems to be complete. The enemy in his flight is leaving behind large numbers of guns and great quantities of war stores as he endeavors to reach the passage over the Tagliamento river. It seems not improbable that on the plains and in the region east and west of Belluno large numbers of the enemy are destined to be captured.

On the western battlefield, there is still little fighting of a violent character but the intensive operations of the airmen seems to presage an early return of battles of major importance. In Belgium both the British and Belgian troops have made slight gains while the French on the southern part of the line in France have advanced their line and taken prisoners. Aside from reciprocal artillery duels and continued aerial raids by the Americans and Germans, the American sectors east and west of the Meuse have been comparatively quiet.

In the Serbian theatre the Austro-Hungarian eastern army has succeeded in outdistancing the Serbians and reached their home territory across the Danube. In Mesopotamia the Turkish army which for so long held up the British in their attempts to proceed up the Tigris river, but which lately has been suffering severe defeats, has surrendered in its entirety to the British commander.

Through the defection of Turkey the plight of the Teutonic allies becomes a critical one. The gateway to the eastern boundaries of Germany and Hungary is opened by way of the Dardanelles and the Bosphorus and doubtless shortly Allied fleets will invade the Black Sea and begin operations in this heretofore unattainable region. Such warships as the Germans have afloat in the Black Sea including the Russian Black Sea fleet will prove no barrier to the mighty floating fortresses the Entente can impose against them.

Shattered little Roumania, by the collapse of Turkey is likely soon to be inside the Entente fold and aiding in the operations against the nations which crushed her. Likewise the armistice which lets Turkey out of the war is a menace to the enemy in Russia and is likely to prove of the greatest value in quickening a return of normal conditions in that country.

Suspicion is the word which still summarizes the public attitude toward the Central Powers' manoeuvres.
