

Serious as the loss of New Brunswick had been it was gratifying to know that the number of cases and deaths were less than those in almost any province or state of the same population. They had been caleld upon to take charge of outbreaks of typhoid, diphtheria and small-pox and he was pleased to say that they were handled promptly and efficiently. Their duties called them to inspect certain buildings, school-houses, water supplies. street cars, and railway coaches. It was calculated that for every death there were 14 cases of sickness from preventible causes, therefore for 800 deaths there would be constantly in the province 12,000 inhabitants ill. The total economic saving to the province would be \$3,180,000 per year or \$1,000,000 more than the revenue. Under the old regime that amount had been lost to the country year after year.
