"Whatever else you do, don't put fur niture in the corners," is the wise advice given by a decorator who has had furnishing of small and medium sized and comforting as to entirely banish coughs, catarrh and throat trouble in it hot and seal it tight.

Cool French blue and white pencil striped silk formed a quaint, attractive nightgown and chemise set designed and made by a recent bride for her


