



## TO SHRINK A SWEATER.

You can shrink a sweater somewhat by washing it in very hot water, rinsing in clear hot water and immediately putting it into cold water; change from heat to cold shrinks the wool. Drying a sweater in the cold air after such a washing also shrinks it. Before the garment is dry, lay it on the table flat and pull into shape, allowing it to dry thus. Don't hang the sweater up, or it will stretch, but dry it in a cheesecloth bag or pillowcase.

If one teaspoonful of very hot water is put in the beginning on the yolk of the egg when one is making mayonnaise, it will keep it from curdling and will make the process less lengthy. To prevent salt sticking in shaker,
