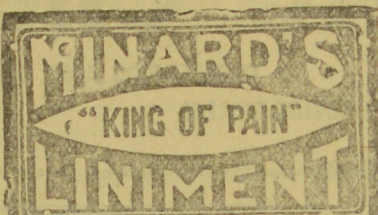

FORTY STYLES OF WRITING IN SPIRITUAL MESSAGES

Dr. A. D. Watson Presents the Case of the "Twentieth Plane" to Hebrew Students—Tells of a Conversation With Abraham Lincoln, Who Asked Him to Write a Poem—Has Had Many Spirit Communications.

"I have studied the subject for thirty years, but I have still an open mind on the question," said Dr. A. D. Watson in the course of an address on the "Twentieth Plane," delivered to the members of the Hebrew Students' Association in the Zionist Building on Saturday night. The theory of authenticity was the most acceptable explanation, in the opinion of the speaker, who stated however, that he was prepared to consider any other theory that would explain the question involved more simply than the one outlined by him in the Twentieth Plane.

"This is not a new topic," continued Dr. Watson. "It has been before the public for a number of years."

He mentioned the names of Lombroso, Alfred R. Wallace, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, and Dr. Harrington as being associated with the question of psychical phenomena. He had been a close student of the subject for thirty years but not until the recent publication of the book had he ever uttered a word to the public on the matter. It had only been his experiences of the past year that had decided him to place the whole question before the public.

Dr. Watson told how the remarkable revelation of Louis Benjamin had first been brought to his attention. Benjamin had informed him that he had been receiving messages from his mother, who had been dead for thirteen years. Dr. Watson was at first very sceptical about the matter, but he had since become convinced, he said, of the authenticity of the messages communicated by Benjamin.

Warns Against Ouija

Although these had been received through the medium of the Ouija Board, Dr. Watson warned his hearers against the general use of it.

"I despise it, and I don't use it myself. I haven't got a Ouija Board and I wouldn't buy one," he said.

The first messages received by Benjamin had come from Dr. Watson's mother and from Rev. John Potts, a former pastor of his church.

"My mother said to me that I was to write a poem on Lincoln. 'He is here now—would you like to speak to him,' she had said. I answered 'I would be delighted.' The board said, 'This is Abe.' I said, 'Mr. Lincoln, my mother says I am to write a poem about you. What would you like to have me say?' 'I cried with the lowly, I never thought nor permitted a cruelty,' replied Lincoln. This I thought was rather singular and in the spirit of Lincoln.

Dr. Watson had asked Lincoln to whom he would like to have the poem addressed, to which he replied: "Address it to Ann Rutledge."

"We sat together over one hundred hours and communicated with over one hundred well-known persons," said Dr. Watson, adding: "You say, how silly it seems that all these great men should speak to Dr. Watson? We have had at our meetings university professors, honor graduates in philosophy, science and other faculties, and never has there been a person, who after sitting with us for four meetings did not come to the conclusion that the theory of authenticity was the easiest one to accept."

Although at first he had no intention

The owner of the bear has devised a bit of sport truly Roman in its scope for the amusement of itself and his fellow Solons. Bruin will be conducted to a patch of woods and released, whereupon the lawmakers who have been invited will arm themselves with shotguns and set out to slay the ravenous beast. The bear of course may not see the fun. Having spent his life chained to a post until he has come to look upon man as a friendly being, from whom he has been wont to receive choice bits of food, it is just possible that should the bear meet one of the legislative Nimrods amicably with the idea that he was in the woods, Bruin might approach to receive a lump of sugar. Should he be greeted with a charge of shot instead, it might be that those "horrible, hairy, human" qualities which Mr. Kipling celebrated so alliteratively might suddenly reassert themselves with disastrous results to the hunters.
