CHURCHES AND ADVERTISING.

"Advertise in every newspaper-Presbyterian publicity pays." This will be the slogan at the Presbyterian General Assembly to be held in St. Louis, Mo., from May 15th to May 23rd. Mr. J. B. Wooten, director of publicity for the Presbyterian Church, will appear before the Assembly and will ask that it endorse a system of local advertising in every community where there is a Presbyterian church Mr. Wooten will recommend that Pres byterian churches throughout the country make an appropriation in their annual budgets to pay for dis-play advertising in the local news papers. He claims that space in newspapers is the most valuable publicity obtainable and in this he is undoubtedly right. He urges that the churches ought to be just as alert to this as any business.

Mr. Wooten cites the example of Los Angeles, where the churches adhappy; but still he never had corns. vertise more heavily than the theatres and where the churches are invariably filled, many of them to overflowing. The Presbyterians of Los Angeles advertised heavily in the local newspapers for a recent conference of the Presbyterian New Era Movement in that city, and as a result thousands were turned away from the meetings unable to gain admittance.

In his report to the General Assembly, Mr. Wooten will say: "The news paper is the most insistent factor in modern life. It enters our affairs every morning, noon and night. It is the one force that finds an open door at every house. It is our companion at meals, on trains, in street cars, at the club and in the home. It is the voice of the world, the medium of mankind by which and through which the four quarters of the earth are kept as a fat one. in close contact with one another by the simple communication of current

"The newspaper is a moulder of public opinion, and often private opinion because primarily it is the chief purveyor of information. Politics, sci ence and business cannot do without it, nor can that greatest of all institutions, the church.

"It is simply good common sense for the church to engage systematically in paid advertising in the news papers. No church can afford not to.
