



Apricot Rice Pudding.

Four cups cold boiled rice, two cups sugar, two cups dried apricots, one cup boiling water. Arrange in layers, first rice, then fruit, sugar and so on, having rice on top. Pour boiling water over the top and bake one hour, cov-well with turpentine till every trace having rice on top. Pour boiling water ered closely. Serve with cream or milk.



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
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
