## WOMEN IN THE NEWS.

Miss Hammerstein Gets a Divorce—  
The First Women to Cross the  
English Channel by Air.

Miss Stella Hammerstein, daughter of the great Oscar, well known in Boston before she became a movie star, was divorced in New York yesterday when her husband, Lawyer John C. Keating, got his decree. The man in the case, Charles Pope, also is a film favorite. Keating told of the scene presented to the view when the detectives raided her apartment.

Mrs. Frank Case and her 17-year-old stepdaughter Margaret of New York were the first women to cross the English Channel in an airship it was made known this week by Mr. Case proprietor of the Hotel Algonquin. Both have been overseas for more than a year in Y. W. C. A. war work. The daughter now is being educated abroad.

Mrs. Florence Brainerd Grimwood is handsome only 19 and was educated in a convent. She belongs in Chevy Chase Md. Three years ago when in New York she was married after a whirlwind courtship to a counterfeit war hero claiming to be William Grimwood. In due time a little girl came. A few months ago Grimwood was identified as one William Archer, wanted in London, where he has a wife and family. The American girl yesterday was given a divorce with right to retain custody of the child, who will bear the name of Grimwood.

Miss Inez Wilson, the brilliant blonde Canadian girl living in New York, laughed heartily when asked last night if the Prince of Wales had proposed to her, as reported. She was quite the favorite at the ball given the prince by Mrs. Whitelaw Reid, Nov. 19. Miss Wilson was not one of the guests but the prince, who had met her before, learned she was in the city and had her included. She, the daughter of a prominent Montreal physician, says: "Of course it was no love affair. The prince has too much sense for that and so have I too."

Mrs. Eugenie Norwood Cox, widow of the New York broker, who claimed the reason she bounced a glass off the nose of Brother-in-Law Joel Rathbone of the National Surety Company was because he, handling her trust fund, refused to relieve her destitution and that of her boys, was found guilty of disorderly conduct in so doing, but the judge declined to impose any sentence. The brother-in-law told the court that things had been smoothed over and his nose was better, and that the family had decided to see that Mrs. Cox and her family were properly provided for. He said she was undoubtedly a fine shot with a tumbler. The episode put his office in an uproar when sister-in-law concluded her peroration by deftly heaving a glass of mineral water without error across the room to Rathbone's back.

Miss Mary Pickford finds life just one succession of trials. Now her former lawyer, Samuel Field, who lost his suit against her in the lower court, where he tried to collect a law bill of \$5,000, has won in the court of appeals and a new trial is to be held.

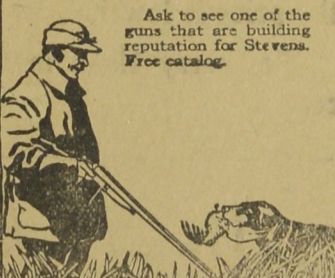
