Twenty Casualties

On the authority of Brigadier-General H. D. B. Ketchen, general officer commanding military district num ber ten, there was a total of twenty casualties among the strikers, returned soldiers, sympathizers and onlook ers in today's fatal riot. An unconfirmed report says that two aliens who were shot, are now in the hospital and in a precarious condition.

Another man is said to have been shot through the foot. The remainder may be described as walking wounded cases, being ridden down by the mounted police or bludgeoned.
