**REPETITION OF RUGBY HISTORY IS NOTICEABLE**  
 History seems to be repeating itself as far as U. N. B. experiences in regard to intercollegiate Rugby championships are concerned. The King-Richardson trophy which first went into competition in the autumn of 1913 was awarded to U. N. B. that season as the Red and Black had one win and one draw to its credit while Acadia had a tie and a draw and Mount A one defeat and one tie. But after the U. N. B. never succeeded again in putting her name on the cup which finally became the property of Acadia. There were three-cornered ties in the league, however.  
 If winning the cup the first season of competition is a hoodoo U. N. B. seems to have struck it again for the Clark trophy was won by the local college in 1914 and in the present season after making a splendid bid for it the Red and Black has missed it by one try. In 1904 U. N. B. beat Acadia here but lost at Sackville.  
 With the bulk of the 1918 team at college again next year as is expected, the Red and Black can make another effort to put its name on the cup in 1920.

**MONTREAL WHOLESALERS ARE SHORT**  
 (Montreal Star)  
 Local shippers of alcoholic liquors are almost snowed under with orders from every point in Canada following the announcement of new temperance legislation from Ottawa. Anticipation that the present order in council which prohibits the importation into "dry" provinces for personal use and which went into effect on April 1, 1918, will as a war measure, be automatically null and void when Canada officially signs the peace treaty within the next few days, has also produced a tremendous crop of orders.  
 "Dry" Ontario is in the van, with orders from every town and hamlet, a number paradoxically enough from Walkerville. Cheques for advance payment are coming in by every mail.

Every hour brings its quota of orders by wire.  
 Apparently the heavy stocks laid in prior to April 1 1918 by individuals were insufficient and cellars are obviously bare.  
 A sad surprise is in store for the waiting thousands all over Canada. Montreal houses at least have not sufficient stocks on hand to supply the demand, nor do they expect to be able to obtain sufficient supplies until next summer. War-time legislation in the Old Country has cut the export of whisky from Scotland down to 30 per cent of the normal amount. The effect of the war-time measures to save grain have resulted now in scanty supplies. War-time conditions have curtailed the liquor output of the rest of Europe, Brandy is scarce, port wine is almost impossible to secure from Portugal.  
 The result of it all is that many dry districts must of necessity remain very dry. Shippers point out that if new prohibition legislation be passed by the Senate would-be purchasers will have many months in which to place their orders. They expect therefore that the present unwonted hurry will subside in a day or so, and that individuals will stock up at leisure. Shippers are issuing stock lists which will be in the hands of inquirers shortly. It will be some months, at least, say the shippers, before the legal machinery provided for in the new law to prevent the importation of liquor into "dry" provinces (if such provinces so desire it) can be put into force. In the meantime the right of transportation from province to province will be unquestioned.  
 The provinces will have ample time to close their borders to the importation of liquor by legislation, before the distilled liquors can be brought in normal quantities from the other side, say the shippers.
