

TURNIP CROP REPORTED BELOW THE AVERAGE

**HARVEST NOT OVER,
POTATO PRICES ARE FIRM**

**Lambs Being Sold in Montreal
Cattle in Fair Condition—
Milk Production is
Reduced.**

Crop and stock conditions in New Brunswick according to the N. B. Department of Agriculture are as follows: There are still some turnips to harvest in various parts of the province, although the greater portion of the crop is harvested. The crop, on the whole, is reported to be somewhat below the average.

Potatoes are moving on the market quite freely. The market has quite a firm tone, prices ranging from \$3.00 to \$3.25 per barrel.

Cattle in Fair Condition
Cattle are reported as going into winter quarters in fair condition. The demand for milch cows is good. Prices range from \$60 to \$100 for grade cows. Milk production has fallen off very rapidly, as is always the case at this time of year when changing from pasture to barn feeding.

Butter prices are firm, creamery butter retailing for 67c per pound in Moncton.

Montreal Taking Lambs

Twelve car-loads of lambs have been shipped cooperatively to the Montreal market by farmers in the eastern part of the province. Six cars from the Port Elgin district netted farmers 10½ cents per pound, live weight for lambs.

Died Yesterday

The death occurred yesterday at the home of her niece Mrs. Bruce L. Simmons of Miss Margaret Murdock of Loggieville. Miss Murdock for many years travelled back and forth between this city and Loggieville and was well known here. She was 61 years of age and died of internal trouble. The body was sent to Loggieville this morning in the early train for interment there.

Honor for Dr. MacLaren

Colonel Murray MacLaren, C.M.G., has been awarded the last of many honors, the Order of Avis, presented by the Portuguese government. The order is one of the oldest and most prized of those in the gift of Portugal and has been awarded in recognition of services to the wounded. Valley Railway Matters

The directors of the St. John & Quebec Railway were before the government this morning reporting upon various matters concerned with the termination of the period of construction of the railway. The reports touched upon the legal proceedings to recover from J. K. Flemming and W. B. Tennant certain moneys alleged to have been improperly diverted from the construction of the railway and also upon arrangements with the Prudential Trust Company concerning financial matters. Mr. W. P. Jones, K. C., who is in the city, will issue a statement as president of the company in which these matters will be dealt with.

Forecast of Delay

There is a forecast today of delay in the proceedings against J. K. Flemming on account of representations made to the Government that the defendant is in a precarious state of health and that instruction to the government's solicitor not to proceed with the case for the present, will be issued.
