The Victory Medal

General Military Orders issued at Ottawa on October 3rd give further information as to the Victory Medal This medal is identical in design with that issued by the other Allied and Associated Powers. The medal itself is of bronze and is attached to the riband by a ring. The ribbon is colored with red in the centre with green and violet on either side, imitating the colors of the rainbow. This decoration is to be awarded to all officers, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the British, Dominion, Colonial and Indian forces, to members of women formations under a direct contract of service for service with His Majesty's imperial forces civil medical practioners, nursing sisters, nurses and others employed with military hospitals who actually served on the establishment of a unit in the theatre of war.
