ROYALTY OUT OF JOBS, BROKE MAKE NO BIG HIT WITH SWISS

Star Boarders Who Sought an Asylum in Switzerland When the Central Empires Went to Smash are Not Popular—Cannot Get Rid of Their Domineering Demeanor—Former King Constantine in an Embarrassing Position — Is Little Better Than a Dead Beat.

Zurich, July 26—Switzerland is "fed up" on aristocracy.

Threadbare, but unchanged in their domineering demeanors, the hundreds of star boarders who fled here for asylum when the Central Empires went to smash, are not profitable to the home folks of the Alpine republic and they are far from popular.

Tragedy and comedy are inconspicuously mingled in the plight of the fugitive royalty and nobility as contrasted with what might have been had autocracy won the war.

Former King Constantine of Greece finds himself in an embarrassing position. He lives at the National Hotel, Lucerne, with former Queen Sophia, his brother, Prince Nicholas, and his son, the Duke of Sparto, who renounced his right to succeed Constantine to the throne, and 57 rather dim satellites.

Stands Off Landlords

Although the hotel keeper makes Constantine a wholesale rate of \$10 a head per week for his party, the former monarch frequently has the unpleasant job of fixing it up with the landlord to wait a week or so for his money. Among the wary capitalists of Switzerland and even with his personal friends Tino is achieving a reputation as a dead-beat, because he has borrowed "to the hilt" and failed to pay back. Some of his "touches" have been for small amounts.

The Greek party could have a private dining saloon for an extra \$100 a week but in the present state of their bank-roll, it might as well be a million. So all hands mingle with the common herd in the public dining hall and "pass the salt" to a rabble of vacationers and travelling salesmen.

Has No Car

Constantine has no car, not even a motor-bike, and his chief recreation consists of strolling on the shores of Lake Lucerne, usually alone. His one dissipation is a strong cocktail, of which he used to drink many, but since Germany recently sent a curt refusal to his request for a loan of 6,000,000 marks, he has become more temperate.

Prince Nicholas also walks a great deal, swinging a cane and toying with an unusually conspicuous monocle. The women of the party including Sophia unable to afford carriages, have somehow bought or borrowed several bicycles of varying antiquity and go riding in the afternoons.

Among the people of Lucerne the Greeks are extremely unpopular and as they are "broke" their departure would be welcomed.

Field Marshal "Rests"

At Zurich is Field Marshal Baron von Hoetzendorf, former chief of the Austrian general staff, who beat the Russians in Galicia in 1914 and was fired in 1918 following the great Italian smash which brought the Dual Monarchy to their knees.

Count Leopold Berchtold, foreign minister of Austria-Hungary, at the outbreak of the war, lives close by and Count Andrássy, former cabinet minister and foremost of Bela Kun opponents in Hungary, also is quartered in town.

The Swiss people resent the undiminished bantour of these once omnipotent military and political leaders and they begrudge them their scanty rations of food. Provisions are scarce and prices, already too high are increasing because Switzerland has become the prisoners "base" of a horde of exiles.

Von Tirpitz Unpopular

Admiral von Tirpitz, who first announced Germany's unrestricted submarine campaign is extremely unpopular at Lausanne and Prince Al-

fred f Windisch-Graetz, a Hungarian noble is similarly "in wrong" at Locarno.

The former King of Bavaria leads a colorless life at Zizers, where he occupies a feudal manor with a small companionship of an aged Bavarian general. The former King's sole recreation is botany and he spends much of his time plucking wild flowers and weeds.

Prince Leopold of Lippe a German, lives near the Bavarian King, but their interests apparently do not harmonize as they have not been seen together.

Former Emperor Karl of Austria maintains the aloofness which, for generations made the Hapsburg court the least approachable in the world; and his attitude has made him an object of some bitterness when he might have assumed a more democratic and popular air.

Shabby and Bored

Shabby, dyspeptic and bored, the Hapsburg exiles have plenty of time and nothing to do but reflect, sadly, on the lurid pleasures of the "good old days."

Now it is reported that Field Marshal von Hindenburg is coming to Locarno and the only interest of the Swiss is in the vigor and scope of his appetite.
