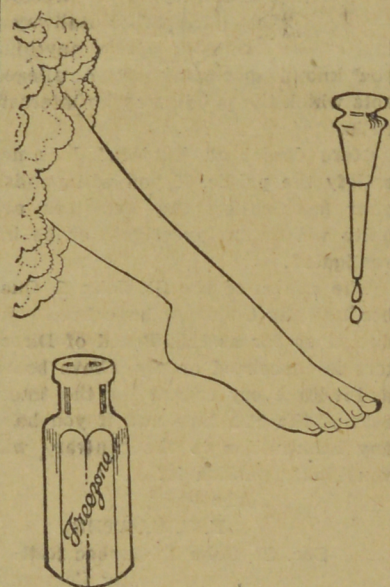

ANCIENT CITY OF JERUSALEM WELL POLICED

Modern Crusaders Guard Religious Treasures—Sanitary Prisons in Place of Ancient Dungeons.

Jerusalem, Nov. 8.—One of the problems which still confront the British military authorities who are administering Jerusalem until such time as the Peace Conference is able to designate a permanent authority for Palestine is the problem of the civil police.

Much has been done to recreate a police force in Jerusalem. Considering the squalid remnants of the old Turkish force which the British had to begin with the present force is a worthy achievement.

So far as the material equipment of the Jerusalem police and gendarme forces goes the British have worked their customary miracle of cleanliness. When they occupied Jerusalem on Dec. 9, 1917, they found the old Turkish prison, a low, heavily barred dungeon in the Moslem quarter, crowded with eighty starving prisoners, all of whom were in such an unspeakably filthy condition that they had to be transferred to the already overcrowded hospitals immediately.

The use of this building as a prison was discontinued at once. It was subsequently cleaned out with a hose, scrubbed and fumigated, and later was put to use as the workshop of a number of Sudanese refugees.

Have Clean Prison

The new prison is as sharp a contrast in cleanliness as one could imagine. It was formerly a hospice for Russian pilgrims, a low, rambling structure situated in the Russian compound to the northwest of the old city. This is now the Palestine penitentiary to which are sent all Jerusalem prisoners with terms up to three years, and all prisoners from the other provinces administered by the Occupied Enemy Territory Administration (South) whose terms are between six months and three years. Prisoners sentenced to terms over three years are sent to Egypt.

There are now 185 prisoners here in a spotless stone building, fronted by a prisoner made garden where there used to be an area of bottles and tins.

Too much credit cannot be given to the British for this new prison. Turkish prisons throughout Palestine were found to be in a fearful state when the British arrived. Some of them, as the Jerusalem prison, had to be abandoned at once, some of them, cleaned out, are still in use, but under a different regime.

The Turkish idea of a prison is a structure of stone and iron bars with prisoners inside it and guards outside. The British idea of a prison is exemplified in the new Palestine penitentiary at Jerusalem. It is, first of all, scrupulously clean. It is, secondly, a reformatory rather than a prison.

Now a Reformatory

Its aim is to make decent citizens out of the men and the few women committed to it. As rapidly as possible each prisoner is put to work. Either he works about his prison home, or in gangs about the city, he assists in the work of cleaning up and beautifying Jerusalem. He is kept clean in prison and is clad in a clean blue uniform.

It is in the personnel of the police and gendarme forces, however, that the British task is still incomplete.

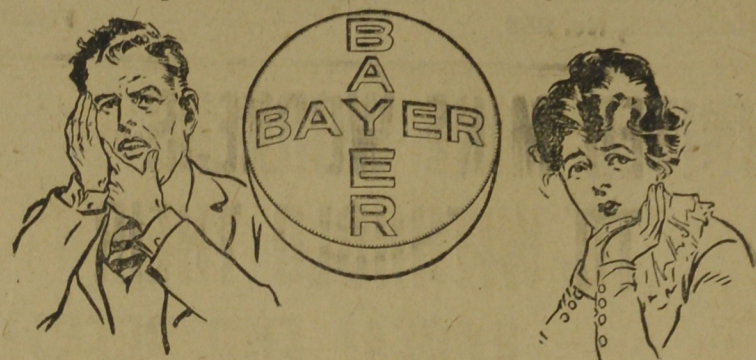
When the British entered Jerusalem on Dec. 9, 1917, they interned, as is the custom, the chief of the Jerusalem gendarmerie, Ibrahim Bey Duzdar, and his cousin, the chief of the police, Ali Effendi Duzdar. They then set about gathering up the remnants of their forces.

In this task they had nothing with which to make a start. The Turks announcing that they would be back in Jerusalem in three weeks had taken with them all the police and gendarme records.

Shortly however, the British authorities succeeded in collecting the remnants of the old Turkish forces. Out from hiding places of all sorts about the narrow vaulted streets of the old

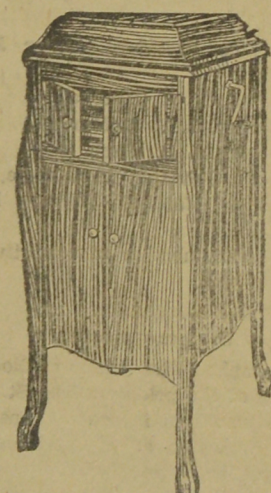
