**MUD-PIE FACES ON NEW
PARLIAMENT BUILDINGS**

**Gargoyles Have Set Artists of the Capital Agog — They are
Caricatures of Leading Canadian Statesmen—Sir Wilfrid
Laurier, Sir Robert L. Borden, Governor Pugsley and Oth-
ers in the List—Described by Some Critics as Disgusting
Jokes—Some Artists Approve.**

Ottawa, Feb. 13.—Art circles in Ot-
tawa are in a perfect furore over the
sculpture on the new Parliament
Buildings. A controversy is waging
which is involving art critics, artists,
architects, sculptors and laymen.

The trouble is over the gargoyles
on the buildings. The buildings are
built in Gothic architecture and gar-
goyles, both in and out, form natu-
rally a prominent feature of the decor-
ations. Many of the gargoyles, in-
stead of being grotesque animals and
floral ornaments, are caricatures of
prominent Canadian statesmen and
public men.

Scathing Criticism.

The controversy started through a
paper read at the recent meeting of
the Ottawa Teachers' Institute by A.
F. Newlands, artist for the Ottawa
schools, in which he condemned in
scathing language the idea of gro-
tesque caricatures of public men as
decorations for all time on the Par-
liament Buildings. Mr. Newlands de-
scribed the gargoyles depicting Sir
Robert Borden, Sir Wilfrid Laurier,
the Duke of Devonshire, the Duke of
Connaught, Hon. William Pugsley and
other celebrities as "disgusting jokes"
and he has been supported by Ernest
G. Fosbery, A. R. C. A., an Ottawa
artist, who describes them as "mud-
pie faces."

Approved by Artists.

John Pearson, the chief architect
for the buildings, has kept out of the
controversy except to point out that
the designs were approved by a com-
mittee of leading Canadian artists. He
has been supported in his contention
that they are in keeping with Gothic
architecture by a number of leading
Ottawa artists and sculptors. It is
pointed out that many old world
churches in their gargoyles have even

caricatured leading ecclesiastics.

The sculptor responsible for the
work is a widely known English art-
ist, Walter J. Allen. He worked on
Durham, Salisbury and Winchester
cathedrals. Several years he spent
abroad studying the French, German
and Spanish Gothic architecture. He
has for years been looked upon as an
authority in England on Gothic archi-
tecture.

Broadly Grotesque.

Some of the gargoyles are so gro-
tesque that the caricatures are scarce-
ly recognizable. This is not true of
the heads representing the Dukes of
Connaught and Devonshire. They
adorn the corner of windows outside
the Senate block. The Duke of Con-
naught's nose is, perhaps, a little ex-
aggerated and the same is true of the
moustache of the Duke of Devonshire.
Both express humor and there is noth-
ing offensive about the gargoyles.

The gargoyles representing Sir Rob-
ert Borden, Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Sir
John A. Macdonald and Hon. Alex.
Mackenzie are all easily recognizable.

One of the most amusing of the fig-
ures is one, the inspiration for which
is drawn from Hon. E. N. Rhodes,
Speaker of the House. He has a great
beak of a nose and has an open eye
turned to the government benches and
a blind eye to the opposition. An-
other amusing gargoyle is that of the
Hon. William Pugsley, who is depicted
smoking a pipe, probably from his fre-
quent summing up of a controversy
with an opponent by the remark, "take
that and smoke it."

"King of the Gargoneau."

In addition to leading statesmen
who have been caricatured on the
new buildings there are many less
prominent men who have furnished
inspiration for the artist. On the win-

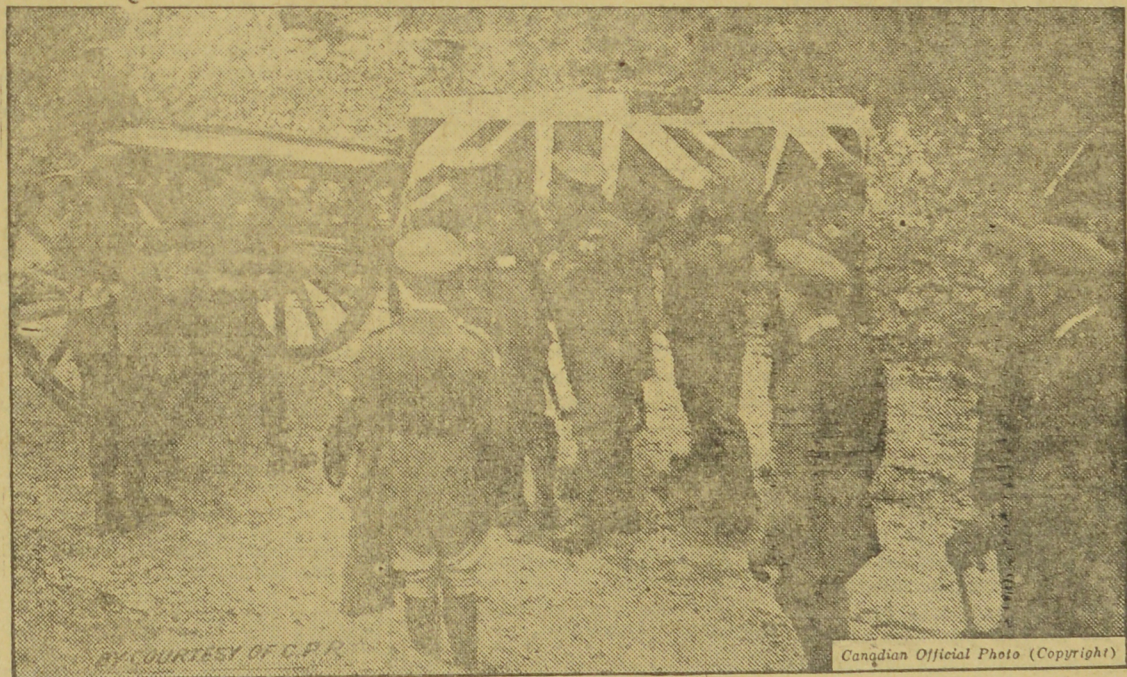

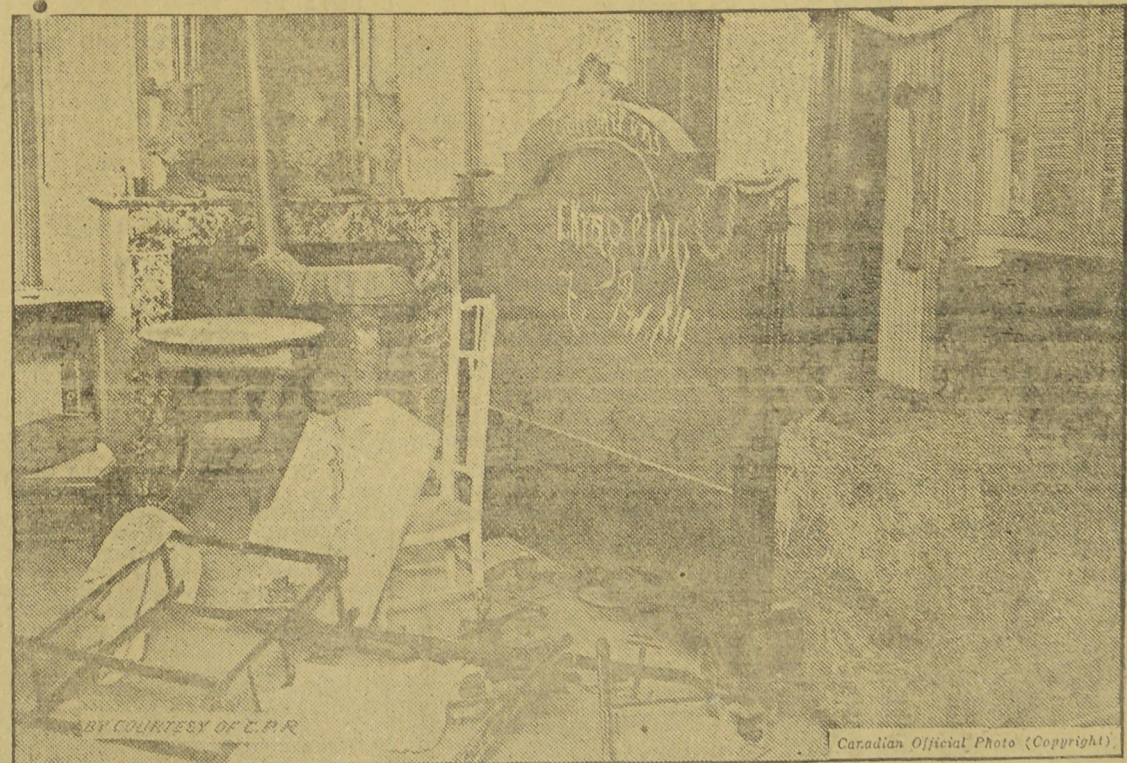
