EMINENT STATESMEN TO ATTEND PEACE CONFERENCE

Premier Lloyd George and Foreign Secretary Balfour Will Head the British Delegation—Distinguished French Statesmen will Represent France—Overseas Dominions of Great Britain to be Well Represented.

Paris, Jan. 9.—La Liberte today says it understands that Great Britain will have three special delegates for each of its Dominions including Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. The newspaper asks why the French protectorates of Morocco, Tunis, and possibly Algeria will have no special representation.

Announcement of the French delegation to the peace congress in addition to bringing a distinguished array of French statesmen into the arena of the peace congress, has begun to give definiteness to the delegations of the great powers, of which the American delegation has been by itself up to the present time. It is expected that the British, Italian and Japanese delegations now will be announced officially.

Five Foremost Statesmen
The leading figures, like Premier Lloyd George and Foreign Secretary Balfour, for Great Britain; Premier Orlando and Foreign Minister Sonnino, for Italy, and Viscount Chinda and Ambassador Matzui, for Japan, are already known although not officially appointed, but the designation of a full list will bring into being the real directing force of the congress consisting of twenty-five members, representing five great powers of the world, each of which will be represented by five of its foremost statesmen.

It will be this supreme council of the great powers which will guide and shape the deliberations and results of the entire congress and while all the other powers will later have a full hearing and a voice it will be the great powers which will initiate and direct the general conduct of affairs.

The personnel of the French delegation is recognized as exceptionally strong, combining the political, diplomatic financial, economic and military sagacity of France.

A French protocol, proposing the exact procedure of the congress, was submitted to the American delegates at about the same time that the French delegates were named. It is now being studied. The protocol deals with the organization of the congress, the representation of the great and small powers and the general order of procedure. It will not become effective until passed upon by President Wilson and the premiers of France, Great Britain and Italy, who constitute a sort of executive council which later will grow into a supreme council of the great powers when the full delegations are appointed.

The conferences throughout today showed a growing driving power. In addition to the conferences that President Wilson had with Premier Orlando and Foreign Minister Sonnino and others, Premier Clemenceau spent some time at American headquarters and was followed there later by Premier Venizelos of Greece. Premier Venizelos has presented a written memorandum of Greek aspirations and is

supplementing it with vigorous personal representation. At the same time Secretary Lansing, Colonel House and Lord Robert Cecil continued their conferences on the subject of a league of nations. The conferences are said to be rapidly giving precise form to the project.

While the delay in the arrival in Paris of Premier Lloyd George may postpone the gathering of Entente premiers and President Wilson, and the opening session of the inter-Allied conference, yet the conferences going on and the appointment of a delegation of the great powers are giving the peace congress the aspect of a going organization.

the Military Cross was awarded to him was as follows:

For conspicuous bravery near Avion on the nights 27th to 30th November and 1st December 1917, when the enemy attempted to raid his trenches on three successive occasions. The personal gallantry of this officer his coolness and qualities of leadership, were largely responsible for the repulse of the attacks. He directed his men throughout the raids, rushed out after the retreating enemy, killed one and carried in one wounded prisoner.


