

Five Foremost Statesmen The leading figures, like Premier loyd George and Foreign Secretary Balfour, for Great Britain; Premier Orlando and Foreign Minister Son nino, for Italy, and Viscount Chinda and Ambassador Matzui, for Japan are already known although not offic ially appointed, but the designation of a full list will bring into being the real directing force of the congress consisting of twenty-five members, rep resenting five great powers of the world, each of which will be represented by five of its foremost statesmen

A French protocol, proposing the ex act procedure of the congress, was submitted to the American delegates at about the same time that the French delegates were named. It is now being studied. The protocol deals with the organization of the congress, the representation of the great and small powers and the general order of procedure.
