Molasses Pudding.

Beat one cup of molasses and one half cup of melted butter to a cream. add one cup of milk, two well beaten eggs, one teaspoon of cinnamon, onefourth teaspoon of nutmeg and last of all 31/2 cups of flour mixed aid sifted with one-half teaspoon of soda and onehalf-teaspoon of salt. Turn into a buttered mold and boil three hours. Serve with liquid sauce.

Sour Cream Biscuits.

Mix and soft three cups of sifted flour with four teaspoons of baking powder and one teaspoon of salt; work in three tablespoons of shortening and moisten with about one cup of sour cream in which one-half teaspoon of soda has been dissolved. Knead slightly, cut and pat into shape and bake in or combinations. a quick oven.

Nut Cookies.

Place in a mixing bowl one cup of and in its natural color is delightful. syrup, one-half cup of shortening, one cup of finely chopped nuts, one-half cup of milk and water, one teaspoon as a foundation and net as an over of nutmeg, two teaspoons of baking dress. powder, four to five cups of flour.
