

## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

WHEN CORN IS RIPE.

Some Housewives Do Not Realize the Possibilities in Corn for the Making of Soups.

Not only one, but many good soups can be made from this distinctively American vegetable. Green corn soup is the easiest to make. To make it boil young corn until it is tender and then grate off the kernels from the cobs.

Force through a vegetable presser, season them with salt, pepper and melted butter and mix with hot milk thickened with flour and water. For a quart of milk a cupful and a half of corn pulp would be wanted, and two tablespoonfuls of flour. Serve very hot.

Puree of green corn is more difficult to make, but it is delightful in its unexpected flavor. Wash and drain a quart of sweet corn and put it into a saucepan with two quarts of boiling water, two or three small onions and a little thyme and parsley. Add two or three cloves, a carrot cut in small pieces and salt and pepper. Boil until the corn is tender; then pour the liquid through a sieve and remove the onions, carrots and other flavoring ingredients. Rub the corn through the sieve after cutting it from the ears. Return the puree to the fire with a little rich broth and two ounces of butter. Stir over the fire a few minutes and serve.

Green corn and tomatoes together make a tempting soup. Cut up two pounds of beef in small pieces and put it in a saucepan with three quarts of water. Boil gently for two hours and skim it. Add several large and ripe tomatoes and boil for another hour. Then pass it through a sieve and return it to the fire. Boil the kernels from a few ears of corn in salted water, strain them, add them to the soup and add also butter, pepper and salt. Serve with croutons.

### RANDOM REMINDERS.

Old flannel of all kinds should be kept for the scrubbing and cleaning of paint. Next to flannel comes coarse soft linen, old kitchen towels, crash, etc.

Two teaspoons of ammonia to one gallon of soft water will clean hard, oil-polished floors. Wipe dry and polish with a mixture of two parts of linseed oil and three parts of gasoline or vinegar.

Large lumps of unslacked lime placed in dark or damp corners in the cellar will absorb the moisture and purify the air.

Paint can easily be removed from glass by wetting a copper or silver coin with turpentine and rubbing the paint spots with it.

To set the dye in cotton stockings, put a good handful of common salt in the wash water.

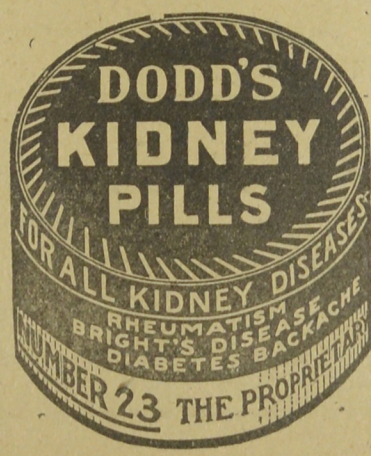
Coffee and teapots should be filled with cold water and a teaspoon of soda and boiled for two hours once a week.

Lamp chimneys need not be washed. Hold them over the steam of a boiling kettle, then polish them with a wad of newspaper, finally rubbing them perfectly dry with a soft rag.

Keep a lump of soda over your sink pipe and avoid that frequent clogging caused by grease and cold water.

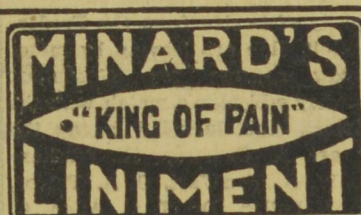

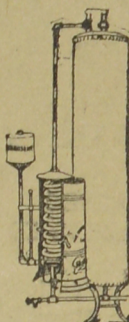
