Finally the party reached Malabresnik and here after two months they were relieved, and returned again in a barge up the river to Archangel where they embarked on the "Czaritta" for Leith, Scotland, and after a flew days leave in England from Camp Ripon they were forwarded to Canada on the "Winifredilan."
