

LINEN PILLOW SLIPS.

A new use for remnants or for dis-
carded breadth of narrowed linen
skirts is to make pillow slips of them
—pillow slips designed to cover the
small most used couch cushions.

Make these slips just like ordinary
pillow cases with hemstitched hems.
They will give a fresh, clean, dainty
effect that is often lacking when cush-
ion covers are chosen for service in
the reaction from the days when to
use one of the elaborately embroidered
ruffled "sofa cushions" was nothing
short of sacrilege.

If you have enough of one color
linen make two or three covers and
use them on the cushions at one time.
When these go to the laundry change
to another shade. But if you haven't
enough for more than one of a kind,
choose the colors that go best together
to use at any one time. In general
shades of linen are soft and blend
well.

As for comfort—nothing feels quite
as cool and restful and clean as linen,
and certainly no material after re-
peated tubbings acquires a lovelier
sheen than does pure linen.

A NEW USE FOR OLD

LACE DOILIES

With the present vogue for flat bib-
like collars, round or square, and odd
shaped drooping cuffs comes a chance
to utilize old fashioned lace doilies.

Two doilies of equal size are re-
quired for cuffs. The linen centres
should be carefully ripped out and
the edge of the lace basted to the edge
of the sleeve, from which it will fall
in graceful, rippling folds.

The collar doilie should be some-
what larger than those used for the
cuffs. After the linen centre is re-
moved decide whether you wish the
collar to fasten on the shoulder or in
the back. If the doilie is round all
you have to do is to cut it in one
place and hem the raw edges, and it
is ready to be worn open either at the
side or the back.

But if it is square and the opening
is to be on one shoulder one side will
have to be cut and faced or hemmed
after being fitted and a tuck taken
in the opposite side to make the collar
fit smoothly.

Of course if the doilie is quite large,
and the neck line rather low, the lace

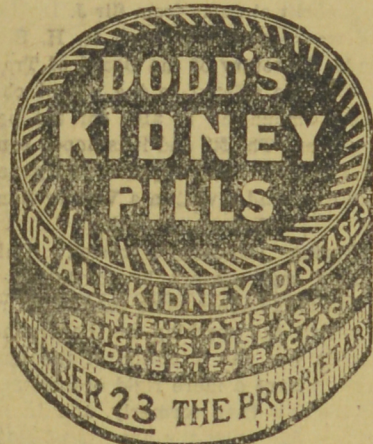

WITH A CAN OF SOUP

I have found a use for canned soups
which makes them of more practical
value than when merely used in the
"heat—add an equal amount of hot
water and serve" method.

When using the stock that comes
from simmering the bones of the Sun-
day roast lamb or beef I do not bother
to add seasonings or vegetables, but
as soon as the stock is ready I strain
and add one ten-cent can of the pre-
pared soups that are on the market.
Mulligatawny, tomato, ox-tail, all
serve equally well and make sufficient
seasonings for three or four times
their own bulk in the stock. These
soups have a nutritive value that ex-
ceeds those merely mixed with boiling
water and have gained a certain
French flavor which is found more of-
ten in professionally made soup than
in those from the home kitchen.

I use the canned soup in the same
way when making stews from left
over bits of meat. And a can of to-
mato or ox-tail soup thinned and
poured hot over a dish of home cooked
spaghetti makes a far more acceptable
meal than that made with a home-
made sauce. The reason probably is
found in the fact that the seasonings
are carefully balanced and blended.

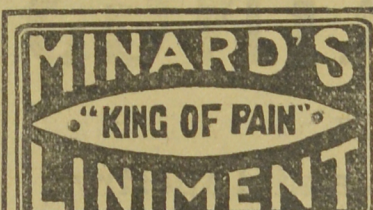

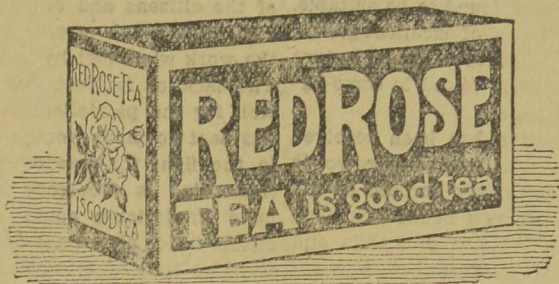

ies living in one or two rooms—such
is the picture Burgomaster Reumann,
of Vienna, paints of that once gay
capital.

It is impossible for Americans to
realize the literal truth of such a
statement; harder still to grasp that
this is but a sample of conditions in
almost every capital or industrial city
in the vast war zone. Vienna is little
worse off than Budapest or Warsaw;
it is probably better off than Petro-
grad. Wherever large populations
have been in the past dependent upon
industries that are ruined, or upon
transportation that has broken down,
the tale of sorrow and suffering can be
told in Herr Reumann's very words.

Ludendorff's recital has given some
hint of how pitilessly territory in
Poland and elsewhere was ravaged by
retiring armies, for reasons of "mili-
tary necessity." No foe marched
through Vienna or into Petrograd. The
stripping of industry and transporta-
tion by and for war was enough to
wreak ruin which calls for universal
pity.

Help there must be if more human
beings are not to perish from cold and
hunger than the war has slain. The
problem is too vast for private enter-
prise or generosity. It requires the
concerted action of the governments
of the world if Europe is not to en-
dure the darkest winter in all its his-
tory.
