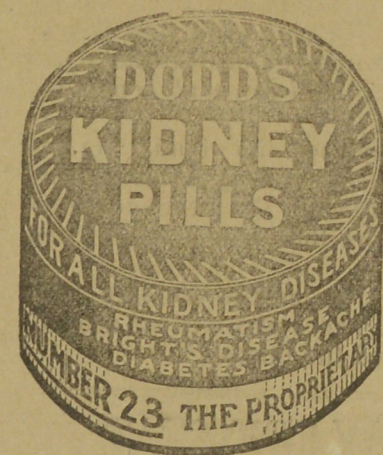
THROUGH NOON TRAIN, ST. JOHN TO HALIFAX

Nos. 13 and 14 Trains to Run
Between St. John and Halifax—To Make Boston Connections.

Time Table changes effective on Canadian National Lines November 30 will affect St. John in one important particular. Trains Nos. 13 and No. 14, now running between St. John and Moncton, will run (daily except Sunday) between St. John and Halifax as through trains, and not connecting with the Ocean Limited at Moncton.

No. 14 will leave St. John at 1.40 p.m. after the arrival of the Boston train, carrying through Boston sleeper for Halifax, arriving there at 11.40 p.m. No. 13 will leave Halifax at 7.40 a.m. (except Sunday) and carry the through Boston sleeper to St. John, arriving at 5.35 p.m. This service should prove most satisfactory to the travelling public. A Standard C. N. R. Diner will run between Halifax and Moncton on these trains.

C. N. R. trains in and out of Fredericton are not affected by these train changes.



MONTREAL GIRL SOUGHT BY PRINCE IN NEW YORK

Had Met Miss Inez Wilson at Coblenz, Germany, After the War—Learned She was in New York and Commanded Her to Attend Ball Given in His Honor by Mrs. Whitelaw Reid.

How a Montreal girl came nearly spoiling the evening for Mrs. Whitelaw Reid on the occasion of her great ball in honor of the Prince of Wales during his recent visit to New York, has just leaked out.

The heroine is Miss Inez Wilson, daughter of the late D. Robert Henry Wilson, a prominent Montreal physician and Mrs. Wilson who lived on the mountain up to a few years ago. Mrs. Wilson and her daughter are now living in New York City. Miss Wilson is a beautiful girl of the blonde type, which the Prince shows such a decided preference for.

After Dr. Wilson's death, his widow and Miss Inez travelled a good deal living in Vancouver, Boston and New York at different times. It was while they were in Boston that Miss Inez decided that she wanted to do something in the great war. After a deal of persuasion Mrs. Wilson consented to her daughter joining an American Red Cross entertainment company.

Met in Germany

The next chapter is set in Coblenz, Germany, in the early Spring of this year. The Prince of Wales was paying a visit to inspect the American troops. An informal dinner was given in his honor by the American general followed by an impromptu dance to which Miss Inez Wilson was invited. Of course they met and at once "took" to one another. Miss Inez loves dancing and she speedily discovered that the Prince did too. But he confessed to her that he somehow couldn't get hold of "that jazz". After that evening they met several times before the Prince left Coblenz and before parting he told her he would be sure and see her when he visited the "other side."

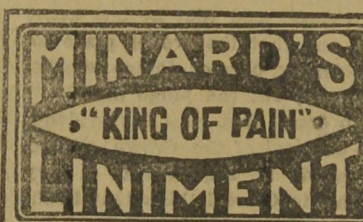

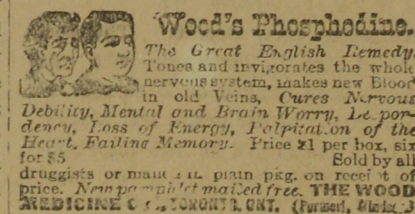
