GLAD TO GET THE LEMON.

When Paris Put Out the Color She
Made It Easy for Americans to
Wear Clothes That Looked Cool
in a Hot Season.

Citron was advanced by Paris in the
early spring. Jade green came along
as its companion.

America adopted both colors, one
quickly, one slowly.

It may be that citron, which is lemon color, was not exploited on this continent as quickly as that bright shade of light green which is appropriately launched at the beginning of spring. It came about later, through the insistence of the dressmaking houses.

It pleased women as soon as the warm weather started. It has, without doubt an appeal to the eye.

Hot Weather Colors.

An axiom of the hot States in America is that one must look cool to feel cool. That is why the South persistently wears white in summer.

True, it is expensive because of the constant cleaning necessary, but it has proved itself the most reliable color, or lack of color, to indorse during the long heated season.

In the Northern States it is difficult to persuade people to wear white, even when they are out of the city streets. It is not the custom of the country.

There is a curious desire instead to wear dark, thin clothes, and while they stood for economy they do not stand for beauty or comfort.

If lemon color and pale water green, which are two of the coolest shades that can be adopted, are plentifully sprinkled over the land of women this season, the result will be refreshing.

In America we lean toward cucumber green for midsummer more than apple green, and there is very little difference between the color of cucumber and that of jade. Both have that translucent coloring that makes one feel cool even to touch it. It is like getting a dip in a pale green ocean at the end of a hot day.

Lemon Combined With Lace.

In France they are apt to combine black with this lemon yellow. It may be in a hat, a sash, a bow of tulle; but over here we put lace with it, even though we may dash a few inches of black somewhere on the surface.

Our tendency is to keep away from black when a dark color is needed, and violet or Vatican purple is used.

This is an old color scheme, this combination of pale yellow and violet, for a quarter of a century ago it was considered extremely smart, especially in evening gowns.

It has now returned to fashion.

SEASONABLE RECIPES.

Fruit Sherbet.

Dice bananas, canned pineapple and oranges in equal quantities. Cover with a little sugar and water boiled to a syrup, and let stand for several hours. Some of the pine-apple juice may also be added. Serve very cold in sherbet glasses.

Rhubarb Honey.

One-half pound of rhubarb, one cup of sugar, one cup water.
Wash rhubarb, cut up skins and all. Add water, boil until tender. Strain to remove pulp. Stir sugar into strained liquid. Boil three minutes. Cool and serve.

Solid part of rhubarb can be used for pie.

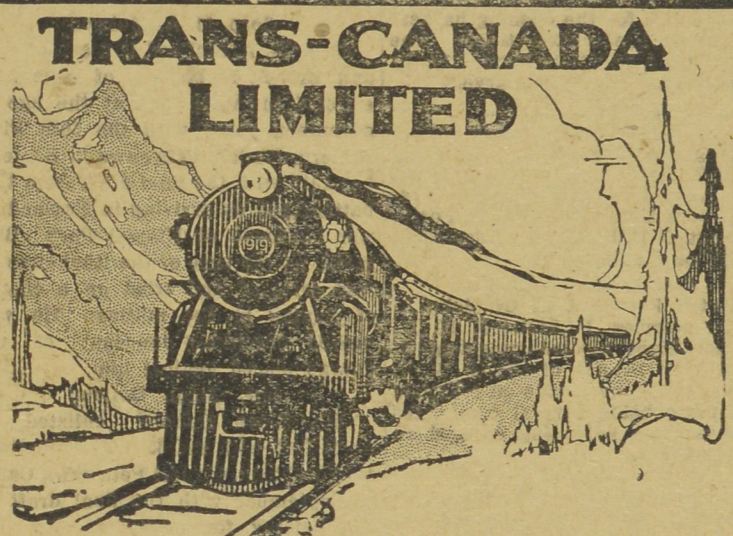
