

Fruit Sherbet.

Dice bananas, canned pineapple and oranges in equal quantities. Cover with a little sugar and water boiled to a syrup, and let stand for several hours. Some of the pine-apple juice may also be added. Serve very cold in sherbet glasses.

Rhubarb Honey.

One-half pound of rhubarb, one cup of sugar, one cup water.

Wash rhubarb, cut up skins and all. Add water, boil until tender, Strain to remove pulp. Stir sugar into strained liquid. Boil three minutes. Cool and serve
