


CANADIAN TOWNS AND CITIES IN THE GREAT WORLD WAR

But we must not lose sight of the fact that every section of our country contributed its quota of the manhood and womanhood which went to make up that great citi-

zen army that has won such undying fame in Flanders fields.


Not by any means the least in adding to the glorious record so nobly won has been our own city of Fredericton and the adjacent country. It is only fair and just—indeed, it is only right—that we receive our full share of the credit.

The fighting men in trench and on battlefield; the nursing sisters who went where duty called; the mother at home who gave her boys and girls to the cause; the various fraternal and benevolent societies whose efforts were untiring; all did their bit to win the fight for Democracy. Each and every one of these will now be given a place of honor in the record that is being compiled—a lasting memento to be handed down to posterity.

It is a matter that has been the subject of thought for some time. How best to commemorate the deeds of valor and heroism performed by Canadians. After careful consideration, and discussing the whole problem very thoroughly, it has been decided that a Memorial Volume will be issued, gotten up in such a way that it will be a lasting and enduring memorial, one that will be worthy of and do justice to our soldiers and citizens—and one that may be placed in every home.

The work of producing this worthy record is now under way. Our part in the war will contain full data covering the individual efforts and achievements of our men and women overseas and at home. It will contain a biography of each and every one of our fighting men and nursing sisters, accompanied by a photo-engraving of those noble heroes and heroines. The cost of production is considerable, but the cost as well as the effort of production is well worth while.

The wonderful work of the Red Cross and kindred organizations will be dealt with in detail. Captain J. D. Black has undertaken the work for the county and will deal with the activities at home, and for the writing of the interesting stories of the Canucks overseas the services of Lieut. Fred James have been secured. Lieut. James was official correspondent to the Ministry Overseas Military Forces of Canada. He holds, we believe, the distinction of being the only War Correspondent at the front who first served as a combatant soldier in the

WHY WAS CANADA PRACTICALLY OUT OF GREAT VICTORY PARADE?

Montreal, July 21.—"Whoever is responsible for the miserable mix-up in London, which almost cut Canada out of the great victory parade, should be asked to resign," the Montreal Star states in an editorial today. The Star continues: "Old London never saw such a celebration and never had such cause for one. And in the great victory for which this Empire thus gave jubilant thanks, no nation played a prouder part than Canada. Yet, official Canada refused to take part and when finally forced to retreat from that shameful position, scraped up a couple of hundred men from various camps in a grudging, eleventh-hour apology for that triumphant participation demanded by Canada's glory and Canada's pride."

"The people of Canada will insist upon knowing why and will not be satisfied with the typical official explanation. At best this unfortunate business was due to an exhibition of stupidity for which somebody's head should fall. But whether it was merely thickheaded incompetence and sudden failure to appreciate a great occasion, or a deliberate slight due to jealousy or personal designs, the people will demand not only an explanation that shall explain, but exposure and punishment of those responsible."
