MEANING TO INDUSTRY OF  
TREMENDOUS WAR DEBT

Britain Must Pay Interest Amounting to Over Three Hundred and Fifty Million Pounds Sterling—Will Take Generations to Repay War Debt—New Policies of Trade and Finance Must be Introduced to Save the Country.

(Sir Oswald Stoll, in London "Daily Express.")

What is the meaning to industry of a war debt of £7,000,000,000, bearing interest at the rate of 5 per cent, plus 1 per cent for redemption?

5 per cent interest on £7,000,000,000 is £350,000,000. 1 per cent sinking fund on the like sum is £70,000,000. Apparent annual charge is £420,000,000.

A loan or debt redeemable by 1 per cent per annum, accumulating at 5 per cent compound interest, is redeemed in thirty-seven years.

Government loans are redeemed through taxation from the productivity of industry. Such loans in the form of a National Debt of £7,000,000,000 would therefore seem to place a burden on productive industry of no more than £420,000,000 per annum for thirty-seven years, or £15,540,000,000.

But in fact the burden is infinitely greater. Every payment of interest, as well as every payment into a sinking fund, looks for a return of at least 5 per cent from productive industry, that being ultimately the only possible source of any return. Hence the real burden of the debt is £420,000,000 per annum accumulating at 5 per cent compound interest for thirty-seven years, or £42,684,000,000. That is the result of the financial system at present underlying industry. If the section of the nation controlling the funds should attempt to enforce such a debit to exact such a return, without freely giving a countervailing advantage or credit, the attempt most assuredly must fail.

When the National Debt was only £700,000,000 its cumulative burden, borne by the great majority of our 46,000,000 people, left several millions dependent on State and private charity, and many more millions constantly living on the verge of starvation, while income tax returns proved the narrowness of the margin of profit on which seemingly successful industries were run in showing that very large incomes went to very few people.

To Save The Country

To this burden could be traced the invidious distribution of wealth; in it was found the explanation of the relative increase of poverty in an age of material progress.

Well, the population is still only 46,000,000, but the debt is ten times greater! Are our statesmen, at the bidding of men who cannot foresee their own undoing in the consequences which this position foreshadows, going to let the country down?

This colossal weight will cause not expansion of trade to ten times its pre-war volume, but contraction of trade to one-tenth of what it was, for before trade could be bled to provide such returns it would have died, killed by itself, that system of financing our industry which is now so jealously guarded.

If our statesmen would save the country they must pay no further heed to the dictates of conventional finance but place reliance upon common sense and fair dealing. They must forthwith endow productive industry with credit right; that is, they must acknowledge in every productive concern a proprietary right in a quota of national credit. They must also assign the use of the banking machinery necessary to the practical operation of that credit to the producer on his paying to the banker not interest as if he were paying rent or hire for something not his own, but merely a book-keeping fee for the operation of the account.

Way to Prosperity

His productive concerns must be pledged both as to securing and redeeming the credit, and the Treasury must support each such property by guaranteeing both obligations to the banker. The treasury must be paid by the producer for the guarantee, and with such payments must create a Treasury reserve for both national and imperial banking purposes and emergencies.

Whenever a new productive concern had proved itself as to security and redemption it should thereupon become invested with its due proportion of credit-right in order to make the system reproductive within the implied limits of economic equilibrium. As war obligations matured this reproductive financial system, which would then underlie productive industry, would simultaneously develop reciprocal means of meeting them. In course of time £7,000,000,000 of interest-bearing debt and its progressive burden would be liquidated from the productivity of £7,000,000,000 of free, productive credit; and what that implies in the additional productive capital, vast industries, incessant offerings of employment and amazing development generally throughout 12,000,000 square miles of British territory.

## MEMORIAL

SERVICE FOR

PTE. E. A. JONES

Middle Hainesville, Sept. 29—On Sunday afternoon at 3 p. m. a memorial service was held in the Church here to do honour to the memory of Pte. Edwin A. Jones who was killed in action at Cambrai Sept. 30th, 1918.

One of the most perfect autumn days greeted a very large congregation. Rev. G. C. Warren of Fredericton was the speaker and delivered an eloquent and impressive address. A trio from Fredericton composed of Messrs. Bailey, Holder and Staples had charge of the singing and rendered some fine selections. Mrs. P. McIntyre of Upper Hainesville presided at the organ.

After the memorial service the tablet which is solid brass framed in oak and erected to the left of the altar in memory of five honoured heroes who have laid down their lives in "Flanders fields" was unveiled by Mr. John H. "Greater love hath no man than this that a man lay down his life for his friends."

The service closed by singing the National Anthem and benediction by the pastor.

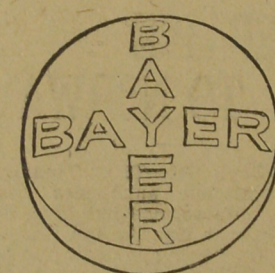
