AROUND THE CITY

The recent visit of His Lordship
Bishop LeBlanc to Fredericton for the
purpose of administering confirmation
to a large class at St. Dunstan's church
recalls the fact that for some years
Fredericton was the centre of the Ro-
man Catholic diocese of New Brun-
swick and ceased to be only when the
provinces was divided into the dioceses
of St. John and Chatham. A curious
feature of the selection of this city as
the cathedral city was that Prince
Edward Island although the smallest
of the three Maritime Provinces, gave
New Brunswick its first Catholic Bis-
hop the late Bishop Dollard and to
that fact the Fredericton parish
church owes its present name as it
was named after St. Dunstan's Cathed-
ral at Charlottetown, the edifice re-
cently rebuilt in particularly beauti-
ful style after the disastrous fire of
some years ago. In early days New
Brunswick was part of St. Dunstan's
diocese.

A sad accident occurred in Queen
street the other day. One of the young
ladies of the Business College was eat-
ing an apple just in front of the en-
trance of that important institution
and having reached the core decided
she had no further use for that par-
ticular apple. Accordingly she tossed
it thoughtlessly toward the roadway
and being deeply engrossed at the time
in conversation with another "stehog"
did not observe that an honest far-
mer had interposed his countenance
right in the path of the apple-core.
The result was that the farmer's nose
received the full benefit of the rather
juicy remnant. Apologies of course
were in order but no doubt that far-
mer is thinking of organizing a U. F.
A. of his own and taking revenge.

Fredericton had a good-sized "road-
show" this week and another is com-
ing next week. Fredericton generally
is a one-night stand for a large pro-
duction but next week a two-night en-
gagement is to be played. There is no-
thing to support the oft-advanced the-
ory that motion-pictures have spoiled
theatrical business in this city. All
the people want is the shows and they
will attend. As a matter of fact steady
"diet" of pictures makes the people
show-hungry. A good circuit of the
chief towns and cities of the Maritime
Provinces almost looks like a good
business venture.

There is no doubt that estimates of
Fredericton's population need revis-
ing. With Moncton claiming twenty thou-
sand and there is no reason why this city
should not claim ten thousand or bet-
ter. The total registration of voters of
both sexes in the city is 3,663 and the
ratio to the entire population is usu-
ally taken one to three. Other cities
of Eastern Canada include the popu-
lation areas in their population. Devon
and Marysville easily have two thou-
sand each and Nashwaakisis, Barker's
Point and the eastern part of Kings-
clear can account for another two
thousand. The grand total would give
Fredericton a figure something like
16,000.

This time next year there should be
some lively football games in progress
on Queen's Square where the public
recreation ground is located. The land
has been graded and a winter's snows
should materially benefit it. In times
past Fredericton produced some good
Rugby teams and it is a pity that in-
terest in the game has decreased to
such an extent that there is no city
team this season. What is required is
a permanent athletic organization of
some kind which will start the forma-
tion of various teams in different lines
of sport. In the days of the New Brun-
swick Rugby League '93, '94 and '95,
Fredericton City had strong teams and
although St. John was the league win-
ner each time Fredericton always was
a contender. After that there was a
