TWO BANANA RECIPES.

Banana Custard.

Place two cups of milk in a saucepan and add one-half cup of cornstarch, 4 bananas rubbed through a sieve. Stir to dissolve the starch and then bring to a boil and cook for five minutes, slowly, the add one-half cup of sugar, one teaspoon of vanilla extract, yolk of one egg. Beat to blend and then rinse the custard cups with cold water and set aside to mold. Use the white of one egg and one-half glass of jelly. Beat to a stiff meringue. Use as a garnish for the custard.

Banana Cake.

Place in a mixing bowl one cup of flour, one-half teaspoon of salt, two teaspoons of baking powder, six tablespoons of brown sugar, four tablespoons of shortening, two-thirds cup of water.

Beat to thoroughly mix, and then pour into well greased and floured pan and spread higher on the sides and that end than in the centre. Now cover the dough with four thinly sliced bananas and dust with nutmeg, and then spread over the bananas one-half cup of brown sugar. Bake in a moderate oven for 35 minutes.

RANDOM REMINDERS.

If milk is kept in a large, shallow pan, it will remain fresh much longer than in a deep jug or bottle.

A wad of tissue paper sprinkled with methylated spirits will give a brilliant polish to glasses and mirrors.

Methylated spirits is also good if mixed with a little whitening to clean and polish piano keys.

When making plain raisin pudding, use a finely grated carrot instead of an egg. It is just as good and much cheaper.

Pie crust when made with milk instead of water is much more flaky and is seldom tough.

A little vinegar kept boiling on the stove while onions or cabbage are cooking will keep the smell from going through the house.

LATEST TYPE OF
TOURIST CARS

One of the Features in Canadian National Railways' Daily Service, Toronto-Winnipeg-Vancouver.

The Canadian National daily transcontinental train, Toronto-Winnipeg-Vancouver, made its initial trip from Toronto with one of the very latest type of steel tourist cars as part of its equipment, the first of an order of twenty such cars in whose construction every point has been considered for the safety and comfort of passengers. This modern type of tourist car, with anti-telescopic device, is of similar design to the standard sleeping coach, the exception being they are upholstered in leather instead of in plush.

Electrically lighted throughout, all berths, upper and lower, are provided with berth lamps. A new feature for this class of car is that lamps have been installed under the seats in the aisles of the car, so that when the ceiling lamps are turned out for the night, light may be provided under the berth curtains, a great convenience for the passengers when passing through the car.

Phosphorus push buttons can be readily seen in the dark, should the passenger require to switch on the light or ring the bell, when the berth is in darkness.

A safety feature introduced is a device for holding down the upper berth, which precludes any possibility of the upper berth closing when in use. Separate berth curtains are provided so that passengers in the upper berths will not disturb passenger in the lower.

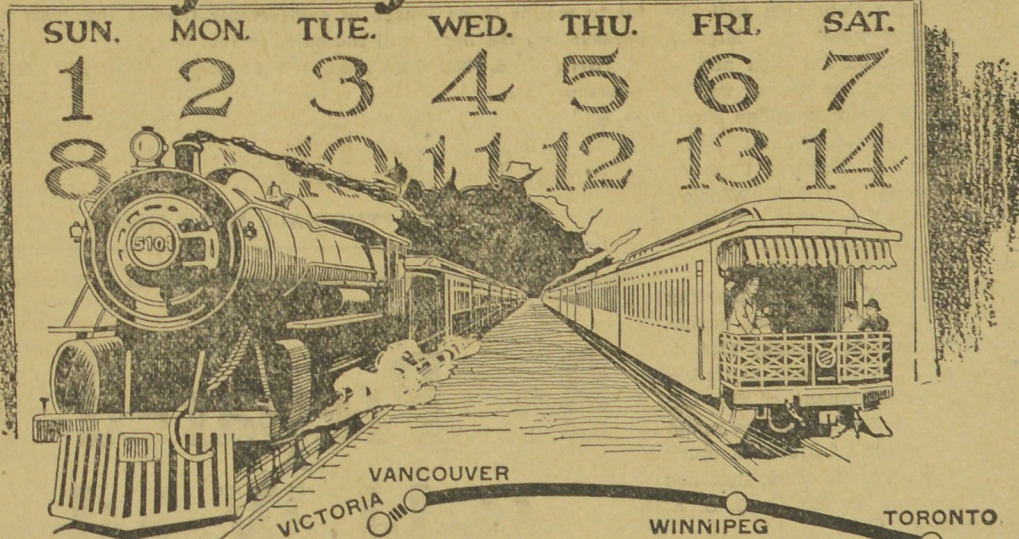
