

VITAL STATISTICS

The service for the collection of Vital Statistics in New Brunswick, which goes into effect on the first day of January, 1920, is in consonance, so far as general principles and report forms are concerned, with those adopted by each of the other provinces of the Dominion.

The object sought to be obtained is that information relating to births, marriages and deaths received by this province should be, so far as may be, common with that obtained by every other province. These particulars will be transmitted to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa, where they will be collated, compiled and published. Such co-operation has been undertaken at the express request of the Dominion Bureau.

These compilations and publications will be of the greatest value to the public, not only with respect to the public health, but also the legal, racial and occupational status of every resi-
