CHILDREN SHOULD BE GIVEN  
NAMES THAT ARE PLEASANT

Strange and Sad Results Often Follow When Family Tradition is Disregarded—Some Interesting Stories Concerning Names are Recalled—Poets Know Value of Names Which Please the Ear and Eye.

That mad man Nietzsche wrote at least one very wise sentence, and a pretty one too. "A girl's name," said he, "should be clear, agreeable, propitious and fall from the lips like syllables of benediction." These canons of selection are impeccable, but alas, seldom observed by those who have it in their power to give to a child at its christening at least one good gift, a pleasant name.

So many other considerations crowd forward more importantly than the single one of charm—family tradition, a sense of romance joined with just plain bad taste or a defective ear in the matter of musical syllables and cadence. Because Ann and Susan are family names the helpless infant of the Jones family becomes Ann Jones and the Simpkins baby goes out as Susan Simpkins and finds herself contracted to "Sue Simp" when her schoolmates' sense of brevity and levity begins to work.

## She Might Have Been "Valerie"

And yet if the ear of the Joneses had been acute little Ann might have been christened "Valerie" for no reason whatever, possibly, except the very sufficient one that it moves sweetly and makes even "Jones" not unhappy while "Sue Simp" might have been dignified if not altogether musical as Margaret Simpkins.

When family tradition is disregarded in favor of an untrammelled romantic impulse stranger and sadder results often follow. For years the name of the celebrated belle of a New England town haunted and puzzled me. Though long since dead, her wit and her beauty still shone and they spoke of her always as Kay-eye-ry. Finally it occurred to me to ask her how her name was spelled. "Caira," said the wise old man who told me; "you will find it on her tombstone." This was even more puzzling until another man was found who could explain it.

"The name is the New England interpretation of the French 'Caira,'" he said. "Benjamin Franklin was fond of that phrase when he was Minister to France and made frequent use of it in public speeches. It was picked up here and pronounced as you hear it. I believe a good many girl babies in New England, perhaps elsewhere in the country, were baptized so at that time."

## How She Got "Ades Memoria"

I told this story to a chance acquaintance at a summer hotel once as a climax in interesting absurdity in naming a child. She smiled. "I think my own name is better—or worse. It is Ades Memoria, 'thou comest in memory.' It is puzzling, isn't it? I was born not long after the death of a dearly loved sister and my mother named me thus."

"But what do they call you, I asked. "Oh, Addie, for short; it's not bad," she answered. "I seldom use the full name."

One would hope not. The imagination of the colored people when it lets itself go works wonders in the way of nomenclature, for they have an ear both sensitive and accurate, and they do not let mere actuality stand in the way when a fresh and original combination suggests itself. I offer Priscilla and Caribdis, the name of colored twins as a specially delightful example. So also was Farina, a very favorite name with the colored mothers of the Jefferson Davis family, who thus interpreted Mrs.

Davis's name of Varina, whom they all adored. Then there was Benzina, a brisk young woman who delighted in her name. So did Vaseline, regretting only that her mother had not expanded it to Lady Vaseline, which as she explained, "sounded grander," while the owner of that most delicious combination of vocables, Belladonna, was envied by all her friends for the music of her name.

## The Negress "Belladonna"

"I named here out'n the medicine chest. It sounded so sweet," said Belladonna's mother, and when I explained its meaning, "beautiful lady," nothing could have been more satisfying than the calm assurance of the reply, "Yass'n, I expect so. Sounds like that. What an impeccable taste! What an ear for the cadence of sweet sounds! No name was ever better chosen, even among that people with a genius for the value of the open vowel and the soft liquid. 'Eleonora Duse' (with

every vowel given its full value) and 'Lina Cavalleri'—syllables of benediction indeed!

The poets know the value of names that address both ear and eye pleasantly—Guinevere and Isabel, Evelyn Hope and Rose Aylmer, Mariana and Claribel, and that beautiful rosary of "five sweet symphonies" "Cicely, Gertrude, Magdalen, Margaret and Rosalys." Shakespeare's names for women perhaps the loveliest of all—Viola, Sylvia, Beatrice, Portia, Ophelia and Nerissa, with Perdita, sweet "lost" Perdita, the only one whose name, so clear and agreeable, is not propitious.

## Some Lovely Short Names

Some of the shorter names of women are also very lovely—Lucy, Hilda, Laura, Nora. All these move sweetly on the lips, but Edna stumbles and Edith and Ruth are inconclusive on the soft "th," though Ethel, with the satisfaction of the final "l," is complete.

The old "virtue names" of our great-grandmothers, Wealthy, Charity, Mercy, Temperance, Hope, were seldom pleasant to the ear, but their connotation made them propitious, at least. Of the biblical names, Mary, Anna and Lois are musical, but the ear at once rejects Jezebel, Abigail and Kerenhappuch. Sapphira and Salome are sweet but one would not call them propitious.

It is easier to secure euphony in a long combination of syllables than in a short one, and so in selecting a girl's name when the family name is short or not euphonic one should seek especially for syllables that will assist it to fulfill all the Nietzschean canons. (Continued on page three.)
